Dear EUSA Family Members, Dear Athletes!

It is a great honour to greet all of you as the Head of the Organising Committee of the European Universities Games (EUG) 2024 as well as the President of the Hungarian University Sports Federation (MEFS).

We are proud to confirm that this is not the first occasion when Hungary hosts a distinguished FISU or EUSA event. We have been the hosts of three World University Games / Universiades (WUG) (1935, 1949, 1965), fourteen World University Championships (WUC) and six European Universities Championships (EUC). Out of these prestigious events, the World University Championships in Orienteering – held in Miskolc in 2016 – was awarded with the title of the Best Organised WUC of that year. It is extremely important for us that MEFS – as founding member of FISU and EUSA – is an active member of both the International and European university sport community.

Having more than thirty years handball experience (including nineteen occasions when I had the privilege to represent Hungary as player and/or coach at international competitions/events), let me refer to my experiences to confirm how important team and teamwork is when aiming to achieve successes. I dare to say that the organisation story of EUG - started already in 2018 - is also based on excellent teamwork as a must have factor, and I hope that you all will also experience this during the realisation of the Games. Two cities (Debrecen and Miskolc) and two universities (University of Debrecen and University of Miskolc) will host the representatives - expecting 4000 athletes, and 1000 team officials and prominent personalities - and the activities of 17 sport disciplines for more than two weeks. The realisation of the EUG will also benefit from the contribution of 900 volunteers. We are expecting more than 400 universities from all over Europe, and we can proudly confirm that twenty-two Hungarian universities will delegate more than 500 student athletes to the EUG 2024. This is going to be the biggest Hungarian delegation in the history of EUGs. (An interesting addition: Hungary had 2 athletes participating at the first edition of EUG.)

It is my strong belief that as a multisport event, EUG 2024 we host will not only focus on sports solely but also on community building. Mentioning these two factors we need to highlight that for our contemporary university student-athletes performance - regardless of in sport or in studies - and community - the feeling of belonging - are equally important. It is clearly visible that beside their sport life, student-athletes are also looking for those opportunities where they can spend valuable rest time filling with meaningful leisure activities with their companions in their own environment. In the organisation process of the European Universities Games this idea was a key drive for us when we planned to include complementary program elements (educational and entertainment events). We trust in that our program will contribute to the successful connection-building of EUG-participants, and that these "not-only-sport-connections" shall give a solid basis for maintaining future relations. This is why we chose the "MORE THAN GAMES" as the official slogan of EUG 2024 as we aimed to express that the Games are not only about sport competitions but also about connections, overstretching through sport and community building. With all these in their "backpacks" EUG-participants shall surely benefit their experiences that they gain in Hungary in their future life.

2.2 ABOUT EUSA

ABOUT EUSA

The European University Sports Association (EUSA) is an umbrella organization that comprises of National University Sports Associations (NUSA) from 47 European countries, providing sporting activities, educational events, and expertise in policy making and programming. The organization is well known within the sector as a safe and strong voice for university sports in Europe, promoting fair play values, and supporting their membership by partnering with European Sports Federations and lobbying within the European Union, the Council of Europe, and other institutions for funding to improve the provision of sport. EUSA is a proud and active associated member of the International University Sports Federation (FISU), strategically cooperating also with other Continental University Sports Federations (CUSF), as well as key governing bodies and organisations active in the field of sport, education, and youth.

Since its founding in 1999, EUSA has organised 16 seasons of the European Universities Championships, attracting student-athletes to 204 university competitions held across Europe. In five previous editions of the European Universities Games, around 19.500 student-athletes from across Europe have participated in the different sporting competitions organised during these multi-sports events.

Through its Institute, EUSA also engages in several social responsibility projects and initiatives on various topics, including Anti-Doping, Dual Career, Equal Opportunities and Inclusion, Good Governance, Mobility, Safeguarding, Skills Development, Sustainability and Volunteering. Many of the projects are supported by the European Union.

EUSA EC, COMMISSIONS, AND OFFICE



Highest body is the General Assembly, comprised of representative of the member associations, electing the Executive Committee. Its members are responsible for the administration and running of EUSA and the execution of main directives taken by the Assembly.

EUSA Executive Committee is led by the President Mr Adam Roczek, 1st Vice President, four Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Secretary General.

Various EUSA commissions are in place to provide assistance and guidance to the many different activities EUSA is involved in. 2.7 ANTI-DOPING POLICY

ANTI-DOPING

Doping is not a guarantee of success in sport. In fact, its effect is usually the opposite. A lot of elite sportsmen and sportswomen who did doping got caught. As a result, they lost pride and were banned for at least 2 years from participating in a sport they loved and lived for. An even bigger problem of doping are the effects on the body.

In elite sports, doping is defined as a violation of one or more anti-doping rules:

- 1. Presence of a prohibited substance in an athlete's sample
- 2. Use or attempted use of a prohibited substance or method
- 3. Refusing to submit sample collection after being notified
- 4. Failure to file athlete whereabouts information & missed tests
- 5. Tampering with any part of the doping control process
- 6. Possession of a prohibited substance or method
- 7. Trafficking a prohibited substance or method
- 8. Administering or attempting to administer a prohibited substance or method to an athlete



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You can find the list of prohibited substances and methods on the internet, as it is updated every year by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and it's valid for every sport.

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EUSA is active in Anti-Doping promotion, and has been a partner in the European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn) and Match point, supporting European-wide Anti-Doping mentality in the youth sector by establishing a moral tenor towards concepts such as Fair-play, sensitizing and raising awareness on all levels of the complex social environment surrounding the doping problematic and implementing strategies to motivate young people to pass on the message and create a strong multiplying effect. Also, the International University Sport Federation (FISU) has been actively promoting sports without drugs, also on university sport level.

EUSA is currently not enforcing doping tests at our events. In accordance with the national legislation of the host countries, however, doping controls may be implemented by the National Anti-Doping Agencies. If such doping tests are executed, the WADA rules and regulations are applicable to all athletes. Please remember that testing can be conducted in-competition and out-of-competition. If you are identified in a Registered Testing Pool (RTP), you must provide current and accurate whereabouts information.

2.8 EUSA INCIDENT POLICY

EUSA INCIDENT POLICY

One of The Fundamental Principles of Olympism is that "practice of sport is a human right" and that "every individual must have the possibility of practising sport, without discrimination of any kind". This principle further states that this requires a behaviour based on "mutual understanding with a spirit of friendship, solidarity and fair play".

EUSA considers sports as an active tool in the education of university students and aims at encouraging and supporting "the promotion of ethics, Fair Play, gender equity and good governance in sport" (EUSA Statutes).

With the EUSA Incident Policy, EUSA clarifies the expectations, and consequences, regarding the behaviour of different stakeholders at EUSA's events to allow the creation of a safe and enjoyable environment.

FAIR - PLAY

With the European Fair Play Movement (EFPM) as our partner, EUSA strongly promotes the spirit of fair play at all our events, having its values deeply embedded in EUSA, while we are emphasising the importance of sportsmanship and the positive approach to sport across our 20+ years of existence.

Fair play is present in sports as the unwritten rule, a moral value that represents the real essence of sport. It represents that opponents must be appreciated and in nowadays practising of sports, more than ever, it is vitally important to defend the values intrinsic to sport: respect for oneself and others, solidarity, and fair play.

Fair play is deeply embedded in the values of EUSA. The objective of promotion and encouragement of Fair Play is already set in the statutes of EUSA, as part of the core objectives of the organisation. Since 2007, EUSA announces the best gesture of fair play in its sports event for the current year and awards the winners the special fair play recognition, Enno Harms Fair Play Award, named after the first EUSA President, a person very much devoted to fair play.

At every EUSA sport event, the organisers, EUSA representatives, and technical delegates pay special attention to the fair play gestures and attitude throughout the duration of the event. By participating at an EUSA sport event, participants are thereby swearing on an oath of respect and fair play. The oath is announced to the world by the student athletes, and by the officials before the official opening of any EUSA sport event.

ERN

The prestigious annual EUSA Enno Harms Fair Play Award is awarded to athletes demonstrating fair play during the matches, following the rules, and pursuing a "clean" game are awarded with a fair play recognition already during the event. EUSA Executive Committee members discuss the proposals received from all sporting events governed by EUSA in that year and select the team or individual to receive the Enno Harms Fair Play award which is formally handed to them at a special occasion – usually at EUSA Gala.

EUSA has always awarded exemplary behaviour on the sports field and will continue with the same practice and vision, that through sport and values like fair play, following the respect for both written and unwritten rules, equality, integrity, solidarity, tolerance, care, and joy, we can contribute to building a peaceful society and ultimately a better future.

The fair play initiative will also be strongly encouraged at all European Universities Games in 2024 as well as the following season of European Universities Championships 2025.

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3. GENERAL INFORMATION

3.1 ABOUT HUNGARY

Hungary is located in the heart of Europe, in the basin of the Carpathian Mountains. With a population of nearly ten million, it counts as a medium-sized Member State of the European Union.

Its capital is Budapest, which is the country's largest city and also its most visited tourist destination. The country is a member of NATO, OECD and the United Nations, a part of the Schengen area, which allows Hungarian citizens to travel between countries in the Schengen area without controls.

Hungary is a country rich in natural treasures. One of the world's largest thermal water reserves, the largest thermal lake [Lake Hévízi], the largest body of water in Central Europe [Lake Balaton], as well as the largest grassy steppe of Central Europe [Hortobágy] are all located here.

The two major rivers crossing the country, the Duna and the Tisza, play determining roles in the hydrography of Hungary. The highest point of Hungary, Mount Kékes [1,014 m], a place of therapeutic climate and a popular tourist destination, can be found in the Mátra Mountains in north-eastern Hungary.

The area of the country is 93,030 sq.km, with forests covering twenty percent. Hungary's wildlife is one of the richest in Europe. The natural treasures are preserved in 10 national parks, 39 protected landscapes, 171 nature preservation areas and 88 natural monuments.

Hungary is the 11th most popular tourist destination in Europe. Particularly popular areas within the country include Budapest, Lake Balaton and the Danube Bend, but the Tokaj wine region, the Mátra and Bükk Mountains, Debrecen and Hortobágy, as well as Sopron and the Fertő Lake area are also popular.

The country hosts numerous art and music festivals, touristic and sporting events each year. Some examples include "Sziget" [Island of Freedom] Festival in Budapest, the Flower Carnival in Debrecen, as well as the Bartók Plus Opera Festival and the CineFest International Film Festival in Miskolc.

Throughout history, Hungary has always made significant contributions to the global treasures of culture, in the areas of arts, music, literature, sports and sciences.

There is a multitude of natural landscapes of exceptional beauty, historic fortifications, and protected monuments of diverse architectural styles in the country.

Hungarian folk music is famous around the world, and has inspired major composers such as Johannes Brahms, Ferenc Liszt, Béla Bartók and Zoltán Kodály.

Gastronomy is a noteworthy part of Hungarian culture, which is shown, in addition to the popularity of national dishes, by the wide range of gastronomy festivals. Thanks to the unmatched diversity of Hungarian wine regions, such Hungarian wines have become world famous as the "Tokaji Aszú", the "Bikavér" (bull's blood) of Eger, or the "Szürkebarát" [grey monk] of Badacsony.













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3.2 UNIVERSITY SPORT IN HUNGARY

UNIVERSITY SPORT IN HUNGARY: The Hungarian University Sports Federation



MEFS, as a University Sports Federation was founded in 1907, the first one in Europe and the second one at word level. Over the decades, it has taken many organisational forms, it has been holding its current name since September 1991. Its members are not only civil sport organisations (clubs), but also (public) higher education institutions (universities, colleges). A total number of 37 higher education institutions and 35 university sports clubs are members of MEFS. Further to that 37 university sports offices (at national level) also support MEFS as its key stakeholders. 205000 students – 98.9% of whom have active student status in a MEFS member institution – as well as 40000 teachers, researchers and staff are linked directly to MEFS. The most important cooperating partners of the Hungarian University Sports Federation are the national sport federations, the governmental bodies responsible for sport and higher education, the Hungarian Olympic Committee (MOB), the Hungarian Rector's Conference (MRK), and the National Conference of Student Self- Governments (HÖOK).

For the first time in its history, MEFS was incorporated into the 2004 Act on Sport (issued on 1 st January 2017). By this act MEFS holds an exclusive status of organising the National / Hungarian student-athletes' participation at International University Sports Federation (FISU) and the European University Sports Association (EUSA) events, and the Hungarian University and College National Championships (MEFOB). The Act also ensures the exclusive right for MEFS to organise and host international university sport events in Hungary.

Further to these legally guaranteed rights and duties, MEFS also supports elite athletes entering higher education through the introduction and maintaining of a dual career system and the status of elite university athlete at national level. MEFS gives priority to university recreational sports to ensure that students (typically aged between 18-28) become healthy Hungarian intellectuals through regular weekly sporting activities.

MEFS is currently active in several areas, with a special focus on the following three fields: national and international competitive sport, recreational sport, and sport for people with disabilities. In cooperation with higher educational institutions, sports clubs, and the respective national sport federation, MEFS organises the Hungarian University and College National Championships (MEFOB) in 40-45 sports each year. The university national championships also promote sports among students, strengthen the institutional identity and facilitate the selection of athletes for FISU and EUSA competitions. In accordance with the rules applied at international university sport level, the competitions are open to athletes who hold an existing student's status at the time of the competition or who graduated from a higher education institution in the year preceding the competition at the earliest. For the third year in a row, MEFS has organised several Hungarian university championships using the community-building power of sport within the framework of the biggest festival of university sport, MEFOB FESZT, where students compete in 10-14 sports over four days. At the end of the competition days a series of interactive activities and concerts are also organised. Year by year, MEFOB FESZT is hosted by different universities, guaranteeing a solid prestigious status to the organiser.

Hungarian university teams are regular participants in FISU and EUSA sporting events. Since 2012, as part of the closer cooperation between MEFS and universities, there have been more and more Hungarian student-athletes entering to various EUSA events (EUG and EUC). This permanent increase in the number of participants as well as in the number of sports, reflects the dedication of MEFS towards the closer cooperation with EUSA. (In 2012, Hungary was represented by 2 teams at the EUG, while in 2024 the expected number of the Hungarian delegation will be almost 500). Teams composed and managed by MEFS have participated in most of the World University Games (WUG). So far, our university athletes have won 128 gold, 107 silver and 123 bronze medals at the Summer and Winter Games. The significance of this success is underlined by the fact that statistics show: almost half of the athletes who gained medals at the WUG also won medals at the Olympics. Until now, our country has hosted three World University Games, fourteen World University Championships (WUC) and six European Universities Championships (EUC). The 2016 WUC in Orienteering (held in Miskolc) was awarded as the best organised WUC event of the year.

The vision of MEFS is to create a healthier society based on both the success of talented university student-athletes and the healthy lifestyle of future intellectuals. MEFS contributes to the healthier life of university/college students by promoting the encouragement and organisation of regular physical activity. The biggest leisure sports event organised by MEFS is the International Day of University Sport (IDUS), a day of sport organised by MEFS partner institutions, where more than 180000 students have the opportunity to choose from over 160 sports in 35 institutions. In addition, every year, MEFS supports the Carpathian Basin University Cup, which was held for the 15 th time this year and was attended by 1900 athletes from 110 teams from 5 countries and 50 universities. For more than ten years, MEFS has also given priority to the National Tourism Meeting of University and College Students (EFOTT), where nearly 30 university-related sports can be tried out in an informal setting in the SportUniverse area, thus contributing to the promotion of recreational sports in higher education during the summer festival.

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3.3 UNIVERSITY OF DEBRECEN

With a history of over four and a half centuries, University of Debrecen is Hungary's oldest institute of higher education continuously operating in the same town.

As one of the largest educational complexes, it is a player of outstanding significance in the system of Hungarian higher education. The university has education, research and innovation capacities, and can boast of scientific achievements that are significant also in international comparison, on the basis of which it fulfills a major role in implementing the objectives of national strategy. The more than 30,000 students enrich their knowledge at 13 faculties, 23 doctoral schools, in an institute of considerable professional values. The University of Debrecen, as an intellectual centre having the widest spectrum of education programmes, undertakes a role in the competitive sector, business life, as well as the social and economic life of the local community.

It maintains an excellent relationship with the city, and is one of the most important engines of the development of Debrecen. In addition to performing its basic tasks at the highest possible level, the university considers it as its mission to undertake a role in the development of the economy of the North Great Plain region, and to appear as a service provider in the innovation activities of the companies of the region, primarily in the fields of health industry, biotechnology, agriculture, IT, and engineering.

The continuously changing social and economic environment demands that the institute shall be flexible, capable of renewal and adjust to expectations. The leadership of the University of Debrecen has set it as an objective to contribute to the education of future generations in cooperation with domestic and international partners, with the highest level of diverse interdisciplinary education and research based on practical experiences. A few years ago, the University of Debrecen recognised the great opportunities inherent in sports sciences, and has since created the foundations of a high-standard educational, research, development, innovation and service providing unit.

On 1 September 2015, the Institute of Sport Science was established, the chief tasks of which include the coordination of sports and related disciplines pursued at the university, the development of degree programmes in sports sciences [bachelor's, master's and other postgraduate programmes], the broadening of domestic and international relationships, the coordination of the sports diagnostics, lifestyle and therapy centre established at the university, as well as the organisation of physical education, leisure and competitive sports at the university. The necessary sports-related and other infrastructure satisfying all needs, as well as the human resources [faculty members, researchers] are all available for this.







3.4 UNIVERSITY OF MISKOLC

The University of Miskolc, as an important institute of Hungarian higher education, contributes to international academic life and the development of Hungarian society in the European higher education space by means of many-sided interdisciplinary programmes and a high level research and development activity.

EN-MISKOLC2024

Beginning in the 1980's, the University of Miskolc extended its mining and metallurgy, as well as the supplementary engineering training structure, which have been continuous since 1735, with new profiles added on the basis of regional social needs. As a result, by the turn of the millennium, the region's largest institute of higher education came into existence with its own independently founded Faculty of Law (1986), Faculty of Economics (1990), Faculty of Arts and Humanities (1997), and a College Faculty of Health (2005). The Béla Bartók Institute of Music and the Institute of Applied Geography have also been added. The internal and external integration resulted in a higher education institution cultivating a wide range of disciplines with a dominant universitas character.

At the University of Miskolc, 41 bachelor's, 35 + 11 master's (with teaching certification), as well as 81 specialised postgraduate programmes have been accredited. The nearly 9,000 students are taught by over 600 professors, researchers and teachers. There are also 7 doctoral schools. A new element of the educational portfolio is dual education, which is available in 26 degree programmes.

The university considers it as its priority task to maintain its current status, as well as to create new relationships and cooperation with other universities and educational institutions in Hungary and abroad. In the interest of enhancing the efficiency of research, it cooperates with players of economic life. In the spirit of the slogan "Innovative Knowledge City" it shapes and develops its future activities. Taking advantage of the opportunities offered by a dynamically developing city and region, as a modern university with multiple faculties, it strives for excellency in the areas of education, research and it's third-mission contributions to society.







3.5 THE HOST CITY OF DEBRECEN

Debrecen has a population over 200 thousand, and the city is the spectacularly developing centre of Eastern Hungary. The name of the town is first mentioned in written records in the 13th century. It was given the rank of town more than 650 years ago, in 1361.

Debrecen was famous across Europe for its fairs and schools. It is located at the cross-roads of major routes of transportation across the Carpathian Basin. Fitting to its role as a regional centre, it has excellent accessibility. From Budapest, it can be most easily reached via the motorway system. Railway and bus services connect the city with other regions in every direction.

Debrecen Airport is the only permanently open international airport in Hungary beside of Budapest. It is connected to all major hubs of the continent with scheduled flights. The historic centre of Debrecen offers a fascinating number of attractions and sights of cultural significance. From the towers of the Great Reformed Church, one can enjoy a wonderful panorama of the city, while the top of the water tower opens up vistas onto the extensive Great Forest. Additional cultural attractions include the Truncated [Small] Church, the 150-year-old Csokonai Theatre, and St. Anna Cathedral. In the library and museum of the Reformed College, founded in 1538, some artifacts unique even around the world are on display: nearly 17 thousand objects are held here, including a collection of applied arts showcasing the treasures of Hungarian silversmiths' works and embroidery culture.

Debrecen is a vibrant and modern city, where one can never be bored. A range of cafés, ambient patios and dance clubs offer the chance of a pleasant evening out. From early spring into late autumn, one music festival is followed by the next.

The services of Aquaticum Spa and Adventure Water Park, based on the thermal water, offer relaxation and thrills alike. Additional venues promising a pleasant time are the Great Forest area with its outdoor theatre, the Mist Theatre fountain, and the "Békás" [Froggy] Pond. It is this area also where Campus Festival, attracting approximately 100 thousand visitors each year, as well as the multiday events of the Wine Carnival and the Jazz Festival, also with crowds in the thousands, are held. Hungary's largest student club, called Hall, was recently opened within the building of "Nagyerdei" Stadium, which is the venue for spectacular, exciting concerts.

The largest event of Debrecen, known across Europe, is the Flower Festival. The procession of the colourful flower floats and dance groups creates a real sense of carnivals. Carnival Night, fireworks, street party and spectacular 30 mapping projections on buildings fascinate the visitors arriving for the festival week each year. Located in the proximity of Debrecen, we can find the UNESCO World Heritage site Hortobágy, as well as the magical Tisza River, the North Hungarian wine region, with its own special values, can also be reached easily from here.

3.6 THE HOST CITY OF MISKOLC

Miskolc is the seat of Borsod-Abaúj-Zemplén County, located at the meeting point of the highlands and the lowlands, at the foot of the Bükk Mountains. It has a population of approximately 150 thousand.

Among the cities and towns outside of Budapest, Miskolc is the one consisting of the most number of neighbourhoods, with the values of the natural and built environment lending a different atmosphere to each.

The unique features of the Avas Hill over the city centre are the centu-

The unique features of the Avas Hill over the city centre are the centuries-old wine cellars; Miskolctapolca is famous for its Cave Bath, which is one of a kind in Europe, and for its ancient park; Diósgyőr for the medieval fortress of King Louis the Great; and Lillafüred, the country's first climatic resort, for the Palace Hotel, the waterfall, Hámori Lake and the dripstone caves.

FN-MISKOI C2024

In medieval times, Miskolc was a trading town, which received its rank as a town from King Louis the Great in 1365. The settlement, which played the role of a regional economic centre from the 1400s, also became an important cultural centre by the 19th century. Today it is the fourth largest city of Hungary and the centre of the region of North Hungary in the areas of administration, economy, education, healthcare, culture, commerce and tourism. In addition to the traditional industries, its leading role is reinforced by the activities of large companies working with 21st-century technologies, innovative small and medium-sized enterprises, as well as the scientific and research workshops operating at the University of Miskolc.

The latter is the legal predecessor of the Academy of Mining and Metallurgy established in Selmecbánya (today's Banská Štiavnica) in 1735, as the world's first institute of technical higher education.

With approximately nine thousand students, it functions practically as an independent "city" within the city.

In addition to industry and sciences, theology and culture have also fundamentally shaped the history of the city over the centuries. In 2008, Miskolc won the title of the Hungarian City of Culture. A defining element of its cultural offering is the nearly 200-years old Miskolc National Theatre, which is the building with one of Central Europe's largest theatrical space. In addition to the theatre, the Miskolc Symphonic Orchestra, "Herman Ottó" Museum, as well as the CineFest Miskolc International Film Festival are the flagship cultural institutions.

From among the cities of Hungary, Miskolc was the first to join the Green City Movement, aiming at the protection of the environment and sustainability. There have been noteworthy smart developments in the area of transportation and renewable energy use, which have made the city even more liveable for the locals and attractive for the tourists.

Everything can be more than it meets the eye: Any person, object or place can be MORE. Let's look beyond surface and find the deeper meaning filling up the slogan.

This way we can emphasizes the message of EUG2024.

We can use the suggested headline variation when we want to show an event related topic and its underlying characteristics that can support the event's messages. We can choose any ordinary object and give it a spin to show that every simple thing can become more with extra work and imagination.







5. SERVICE INFORMATION

5.1 VISA PROCEDURE

General information for entering Hungary

Hungary joined the Schengen Area on December 21, 2007. From that time, visa, and residence permit issued by one of the Member States are valid also for Hungary, and visas/residence permits issued by Hungarian authorities are as a general rule also valid for the entire Schengen Area.

Holders of passports issued by the countries, entities or territories listed on the following website are granted visa-free travel to Hungary:

Participants who need a visa to enter Hungary have to submit their application for a Short Term (90 days) C-type Schengen Visa.

HOW TO APPLY FOR VISA?

- Fill the visa application form.
- Fill the Individual Entry in EUSA registration system.
- OC will prepare your personal Invitation Letter and you can apply for visa in your country.

Important notes:

- We remind that missions and OC do not take any responsibility for delayed submission and for therefore failed travels.

- Adhoc and onsite visa is NOT possible!

- If the person has a visa/residence permit because of university studies in Europe but would basically need a visa, the person can come with a residence permit because it allows free movement.

- The passport has to be issued within the last 10 years. The passport must be valid for at least 3 months beyond the date on which you intend to leave the Schengen Area.

Currency: Hungarian forint (HUF) has been the local currency in Hungary since August 1946. Banknotes come in denominations of 500, 1000, 2000, 5000, 10,000 and 20,000. Six different coins are in use: 5, 10, 20, 50, 100 and 200 forint coins. For the current exchange rates please visit the Hungarian National Bank's website: <u>https://www.mnb.hu/web/en.</u>

Credit Cards: Visa and MasterCard are the most widely accepted credit cards in Hungary. Using card at a payment is accepted almost everywhere, although small businesses may not accept credit cards. Using an ATM in Hungary is safe in the most cases.

Climate: Hungary has a typical continental climate with hot, dry summers and mildly cold winters. July is one of the favourite times of the year to visit Hungary. Although the hottest month in Miskolc and Debrecen is July, with possible rainfalls occasionally. The intensity of UV-B radiation is strong, in the range of 5 to 7, and sometimes even higher.

Sports: 184 gold, 158 silver, 183 bronze Olympic medals prove that Hungary is indeed a sports nation. Several major international sport events have been organised in Hungary such as FINA World Aquatics Championships, UEFA EURO2020, EHF EURO2022 or World Athletics Championships 2023.

Government: Parliamentary republic with a multi-party system. The President of Hungary serves as the head of state, while the Prime Minister is the head of government. The Parliament of Hungary is the country's legislative body.

Driving: Like elsewhere in mainland Europe, you must drive on the right side of the road.

Medicines: Those taking medication on a regular basis may bring medicines in the quantities prescribed by their physicians, in accordance with the length of their travels.

Smoking: It is not allowed to smoke in public transport, pubs, bars, restaurants and in national institutions. It is forbidden to smoke in 5-meter radius from the entrance of primary schools, secondary schools, playgrounds, bus stops, hospitals, or child welfare institutions. Smoking is prohibited during sporting events as well!

Water quality: Tap water in both host cities is drinkable and safe for everyday usage.





5.3 ACCREDITATION PROCEDURE

ACCREDITATION PROCEDURE OF THE EUG DEBRECEN - MISKOLC 2024

DEBRECEN-MISKOLC2024 JROPEAN UNIVERSITIES

The main purpose of the accreditation is to identify participants and their roles at the European Universities Games and allow them to access to perform their duties during the event.

Accreditation processes and entry rights are essential working tools to manage large numbers of people participating at the European Universities Games 2024 Hungary and demonstrate flexible, safe and secure movements between the accreditation zones.

Accreditation ensures that only the qualified and eligible people are entitled to participate at the European Universities Games. This terminology provides a limited participant access to certain areas they need to go and perform their official functions. It also keeps unauthorized people out of the secured zones and areas.

European University Sports Association (EUSA) determines the rules regarding accreditation matrix, categories, functions, zones, transport and catering rights and sets the conditions for that. EUSA, working together with the OC, grants the right to accreditation to all people who have a valid official working function during the event. It is the task of the OC to produce the accreditation cards and lanyards in coordination with EUSA. The Organizing Committee of the European Universities Games Debrecen - Miskolc 2024 is responsible for preparing, issuing and handing over the accreditation cards and lanyards to the participants at the event.

The CC is responsible for the accreditation of the EUG participants. They control the authenticity of the entries, the academic status of the competitors, the payment of EUSA entry fee and if necessary, collect it. The EUSA EC appoints chair and up to four (4) CC members of the EUG, prior to the start of the EUG. The CC is coordinated and supervised by SCAC. The mandate of the CC members terminates with the conclusion of the EUG. The CC authorizes participation in the EUG by issuing accreditation card. If CC refuses to authorize participation, the HoD may challenge this decision to the SCAC.

Terms and Conditions

- The Accreditation Card is a document issued to the participant by the EUSA / OC confirming the identity of the person. The participant should wear the Accreditation Card at all times during the event. The Accreditation Card must be placed in a visible place for the organizer and the security services
- The Accreditation Card entitles the holder to use special services during the event like transportation, accommodation, catering and entry to sports training facilities and fan zones
- A participant of the EUG 2024 is required to present the Accreditation Card each time when asked to do so by the organizer or the security services. It is prohibited to transfer the Accreditation Card to third parties. In case the Accreditation Card is lost, the participant shall bear a cost of EUR 50 for issuing a new Accreditation Card, A request for a new Accreditation Card can be submitted at the Accreditation Centre.
- These regulations apply to the accreditation process for the games and accompanying events of the European Universities Games Debrecen Miskolc between the first official arrival and last official departure day (08-25 July 2024).

5.4 ACCOMMODATION

The OC welcomes all participants of EUG 2024 in Debrecen and Miskolc. It is our pleasure to host the European university sports community in our cities. We are committed to providing comfortable conditions for all participants of the Games. The OC has thoughtfully arranged accommodation for all accredited guests, including Athletes, Officials, Volunteers, Referees, VIP guests and EUSA members. For each group of participants, we have chosen an accommodation from which the competition venues, other event venues, the downtown and touristic attractions are easily accessible.

The Organising Committee reserves the right to make changes. In case of any changes, participants will be informed in advance.

5.4.1 DEBRECEN Athletes & Officials

Athletes are accommodated at the two large campuses: the "DE Egyetem tér" and "DE Kassai út". Both can be found in the immediate vicinity of the sports venues, and about 2 km from each other, on the edge of one of Hungary's largest nature reserves, the "Nagyerdő". The Campus in Egyetem tér, which is right next to the Main Building of the University of Debrecen, will host one of the large groups of athletes. 1700 athletes will be put up in four hostels right next to each other: Kossuth Lajos Hostel I, II, III and Study M Hotel provides accommodation in single, twin and triple rooms or double suites for 2x2 people, all equipped with ensuite bathrooms.

DE Kassai út Campus hosts nearly 1000 athletes in the Campus Hotel and Campus Hotel B. This accommodation is close to several competition venues.

We strive to book rooms for participants and team managers of the same sports discipline in the same hotel. Entrance to the hotels is allowed only for those with accreditation.

Reception is open 7/24, in addition an info desk and volunteers will be at the participants' disposal with the sufficient information and update regarding the competition, transport, menus, restaurants' opening times, any additional services as well as tourist information, etc. Meeting rooms, common places, laundry facilities as well as Wi-Fi (with standard access codes) are at the athletes' disposal in all the hostels free of charge. Medical service is provided in Kossuth Lajos III. hostel. Parking lots will be available at the Campus in Egyetem tér in sufficient number.

A wide range of sports facilities are available, including free use of the outdoor fitness park, athletics track and the nearby UniFit fitness gym at the DEAC Sport Campus and the DE Kassai út Campus.

They will stay in triple rooms with ensuite bathroom in the Markusovszky Lajos III Hostel at the Auguszta Campus, University of Debrecen, situated in the immediate vicinity of the Egyetem tér Campus. Housekeeping service, free internet access and self-service laundry are provided. There are indoor and outdoor social spaces as well as sports facilities in the hostels, which may help team building.

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When allocating accommodation for the referees, special attention was paid to the factor that it should be near the competition venues. They will be put up in twin rooms – breakfast included – in two three-star hotels: Hotel Sport and Study K Hotel. There are free parking lots belonging to both hotels for the accredited participants. In addition, shuttle service – in accordance with EUSA requirements – is also provided for them. Rooms in the three-star hotels are equipped with towels and free toiletries, furthermore housekeeping service, free internet access and parking lots are also provided.

EUSA MEMBERS, VIPS

EUSA Family and VIP guests will be accommodated in Hotel Lycium****. The wellness section of the hotel as well as other hotel services are also at the guests' disposal. The hotel is situated in the city centre, still close to the competition venues, the majority of which can be reached by public transport within 10 minutes.

5.4.2 MISKOLC Athletes & Officials

Athletes' village is located at the central location of the event, in the Campus of the University of Miskolc. Athletes and Officials will enjoy the hospitality of university dormitories and student hostel. The Campus is a real city within the city, surrounded by an 85 acres park under the Bükk Mountains, where everything is located in one place: academic buildings, student service units, dormitories, sports facilities, shops, and entertainment venues. Its unique atmosphere and location will provide safe and comfortable conditions for both the sport and the social activities. There are six dormitory buildings (E1, E2, E3, E4, E5, E6) and a student hostel called Uni-Hostel providing an accommodation capacity of nearly 2 000 beds. Four of the buildings (Uni-Hostel, E1, E5, E6) are renovated with single, double, triple rooms or 2x2 apartments with own bathroom. The other three buildings (E2, E3, E4) have rooms with 2-4 beds with common showers on the corridor.

Each team will be roomed as a group. Due to space limitations, Team Officials may be quartered in different buildings than Athletes. Only accredited persons may enter the buildings. In addition to the dormitory assigned to you, you can also enter other buildings, but you have to register there as a guest because of security reasons and hand over your accreditation card. 24 hour reception, and Info Desk operated by volunteers will support you during your staying. Volunteers shall furnish all participants with a lot of useful information about competitions, transport, menus, restaurant opening hours, services, touristic information, etc. In each building there is free Wi-Fi, bookable meeting room and self-service laundry room for free. Beside the self-service option, payable laundry service will also be available at the Campus, where you can pay laundry fee per official pricelist. The standard part of the room includes two towels as well. Cleaning service will be provided every third days, which can be cancelled if you don't need it. 24-hour medical assistance will be available on the ground floor of building E4. Sufficient number of parking places are located at the Campus.

A wide range of sports services await guests, such as an outdoor fitness park, an outdoor basketball court and an athletics track. The indoor fitness room, a swimming pool and sauna are available for your own cost.

Check-in

The earliest check-in time is 16:00. Those who arrive earlier can wait at the Campus area where they can have a rest and use common areas and toilets. Room keys or guest cards will be delivered to the HoD or individual Athletes during the accreditation process, who will be provided with directions to the location. Subsequently, the Teams have the option to check in independently or with the help of the attaché. The Accreditation Center is conveniently located within walking distance. In buildings where a magnetic card system is available, participants can keep their keys with them, while traditional keys must always be returned at the reception. In case of a room key lost, replacement can be obtained for a fee of 15 000 HUF (~38 EUR).

Check-out

The latest check-out time is 10 am. Luggage storage is available for those who leave later. On the day of departure, all the rooms dedicated to a team or certain group of participants will be inspected in the presence of the HoD and an OC appointed representative. If damage occurs in the rooms, the participant concerned must settle the compensation for damages at the reception before departure. Compensation list will be available in each room.

Damages

It is highly recommended that all items and accessories in the rooms and in the common areas (kitchenette, laundry room, meeting room, etc.) are used carefully, environmentally conscious, and as intended, for your own and others safety and conveniences. Please note that you will be responsible for any damages that occur during your stay. Surveillance cameras are in place in common areas, rooming lists are available to determine accountability and rooms will be inspected upon key return at check-out.

House Rules

Will be available in each room and delivered to the delegations, in which the community rules and practical information that are important for your own and others, comfort and safety are summarized. We would like to draw attention to some of the more important ones:

- Partying and alcohol are not allowed in the dormitory rooms.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the buildings.
- We ask you to adhere the Quiet Hours between 23:00 and 07:00. Be respectful of other participants' rest time!

Security personnel will be monitoring the Athletes' Village, especially after midnight. While we encourage fun, we also ask you to behave reasonable.





VOLUNTEERS

Given that we welcome candidates from all over Hungary and more than that, from all over Europe to join our esteemed Volunteer Team, we also provide accommodation for non-local applicants. Their accommodation site is located outside the Campus in the complex of the Miskolc Law Enforcement Technical School (MRVT), and it is accessible by a comfortable 20-minute bus trip from the Campus. In 3 renovated dormitory buildings (E2, E5, E6) 3, 4 and 5-bedded rooms are available, with room cleaning service, free of charge internet access and self-service laundry rooms. The dormitories have indoor and outdoor community spaces and sports fields that will support organized team building activities. Supermarket, shops and fast-food restaurants are within walking distance, and the city center can also be reached by bus.

5.5 CATERING

The OC provides catering services to all accredited participants of the EUG in accordance with Minimum Organizational Requirements. Three meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner) will be served per a day. Based on the confirmed Travel Plan, lunch is served on the day of arrival for participants arriving before 15:00, while on the departure day only breakfast is arranged. For those leaving before opening hours, a pre-packed breakfast will be provided and will be available for pick-up at dinner on the previous evening. Please ensure that you confirm the exact details of your travel plan by the deadline. Adequate arrangements will be made on the day of Opening and Closing Ceremonies as well for catering provision for all participants.

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Catering locations and opening times have been determined considering the location of the venues and the planned competition schedule for each sport, with the aim of ensuring that all participants can eat comfortably in a canteen/restaurant environment. Nevertheless, if the sporting programme conflicts with opening times, i.e. if a participant is prevented from eating breakfast or lunch at least 150 minutes before the match and dinner at least 90 minutes (plus travel time) after the match, teams and individual athletes will be able to order pre-packed meals, which must be requested in advance by 22:00 the day before.

The menus follow the standards of European cuisine, but also take into account the dietary requirements, cultural/religious and special dietary needs of the participants. There is something for everyone, whether you are a meat-lover, fish-lover, vegetarian, gluten- or lactose-sensitive. Please be particularly careful to fill in the relevant section of the Individual Entry Form and make sure that your special dietary requirements are confirmed by the OC (requests not submitted will not always be able to be dealt with by the organisers, so please pay attention to these). Meat/vegetarian and allergen info will be indicated at each meal in the restaurants.

Student canteen, namely CAMPUS I, is in walking distance from the dormitory buildings. CAMPUS I is dedicated for Athletes, Officials and Volunteers, its self-service food delivery system will be supported by local staff. The canteen rules will be available in each room and at the Info Desks.

Access will be provided once per a meal, and it will be checked by QR code printed on the accreditation card. Please always have it with you! There will be 3 checkpoints where volunteers will scan your QR code. At the canteen volunteers will help you find your way and provide information about ordering food. We kindly note that you can only queue once for each meal, but don't worry, the portions are designed for athletes. Moreover, you are free to complement your dish with salads. For your own comfort and that of others, we ask you to be mindful and reasonable, and when you finish your meal, take your tray to the designated place. Thank you in advance for your attention! We also kindly remind you that meal-box option will be available if you have a legitimate need, such as not being able to eat your food 150 minutes before your competition or 90 minutes after it. You can report such claim to your team's attaché or to the volunteers at the Info Desk in dormitories or at the competition venue.

Food selection will be diverse. The basic menus are meat, fish, and vegetarian; there will be non-pork variants available every day as well. The daily menu will be available at the Info Desks and at the catering zone. Please note once more, any information about special need or allergy should be given before the event, in the Individual Entry.

In case you do get hungry between the provided meals, you can find a grocery store within walking distance and a gastro bar on campus, where you can enjoy hot meals along with snacks and drinks but remember that these options are at your own expense. You can ask any time from the Volunteers for further shopping opportunities or nearby restaurants.

Because of the expected high temperatures in summer, it is important to pay attention to daily fluid intake. The OC will provide sufficient amount of water for each participant. We inform all participants that the tap water is drinkable at all event locations.

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5.6 TRANSPORTATION

During the European Universities Games, transport services will be carried out using the following modes of transport:

- high-class coaches
- city buses

- vans
- cars

Transport will be organized to all places where competitions and trainings will take place at least 500 meters from the athletes' village.

All vehicles used for transport are air-conditioned and may vary in size and capacity depending on the type of vehicle and the target group. The entire transport organisation during the European Universities Games has been divided into the following segments:

- transfers from the arrival pick up points to the accreditation zone,
- transfers from the hotels and the athletes' village to sports venue,
- transfers to the departure drop-off points from the hotels and the athletes' village.

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Guide what to do at the airport

During the journey the main steps and milestones will be - Budapest Airport ("Liszt Ferenc Repülőtér") - Nyugati Railway Station ("Nyugati Pályaudvar") - Debrecen Railway Station ("Debrecen-Nagyállomás") - University of Debrecen ("Egyetem").

- 1. Get off the plane.
- 2. Pick up your luggage.
- 3. Find the exit and walk to the middle distance of the Terminal 2A and 2B entrances.
- 4. Catch a taxi and go to Nyugati Railway Station or hop on a public bus. The direct Bus 100E departs almost every 30 minutes from the bus stop that is to be found between the terminal 2 buildings on the Arrivals level and reaches "Deák Ferenc tér" in 45 minutes, under normal traffic conditions. The bus operates 24/7 and costs for one line 2.200 HUF (~6 €). Tickets can be purchased from the airport ticket booths or tickets machines, from the driver inside the bus, or via the BKK mobile app (https://bkk.hu/en/tickets-and-passes/mobile-ticket/). You should keep in mind that the 100E airport shuttle ticket must be validated once entering the bus and that no other type of ticket is acceptable for this line.
- 5. Bus 100E runs to "Deák Ferenc tér", you will have to get off here too! At "Deák Ferenc tér", go down to the METRO station, where you shall take M3 (blue line) towards the direction Újpest-Központ. You travel only 2 stops, and get off the metro at Nyugati pályaudvar. Tickets can be purchased from the underpass ticket machines or online or via the BKK mobile app (https://bkk.hu/en/tickets-and-passes/mobile-ticket/).
- 6. When you arrive to the Nyugati Railway Station you have to buy a ticket to Debrecen "Nagyállomás" which costs 3 950 Ft 4 950 Ft (~10-13 €) and the journey takes 2h 55m. Tickets can be purchased from railway station's ticket machines, at a station's ticket office or online on the MÁV-GROUP website (https://jegy.mav.hu//en).
- 7. At Debrecen railway station, all you have to do is get off the train and walk to the front of the building, either through the underpass or the main building.
- 8. Here you have to get on a tram to "Egyetem" stop. There are two trams, 1 and 2, both will be suitable for you, but 1 is goes directly to the Main building of the University where the Accreditation Centre is. Tickets can be purchased from the tram's driver or at the kiosk at the trainstation or mobile app (download from the Google play or Apple store "mobiljegy for public transport" wich costs for one line 440 HUF (1,5 €).
- 9. You have to get off the tram at "Egyetem". Once you goth off, you will be at the main building of the University of Debrecen. Follow the beach flags and the signs of EUG 2024.
- 10. You have arrived at Accreditation Centre. Welcome to the event!

ARRIVAL BY CAR

For cars used by the participants there will be free car parks available on University of Debrecen (maps with the car parks will be provided during accreditation).

All motorway tolls for private vehicles shall be borne by the participants.

DEPARTURES

- OC will ask you to confirm your team's departure plan on the accreditation.
- Transportation on your departure day will be communicated to you at least one day prior your departure.
- OC will only provide transfers to Budapest Liszt Ferenc Airport and Debrecen bus and railway stations.

Medical services will be provided at Clinical Center of University of Debrecen and Vármegyei Hospital of Miskolc. A fast-track service and, if necessary, a separated ward will be available for athletes, representatives of national teams and EUSA delegates at the Departments of Emergency Care and Traumatology. The medical services are free of charge with European Health Insurance Card (the patient MUST present this card at admission!!!) including laboratory and imaging examinations indicated by the local physician. In the case of other types of hospital care, the co-chief medical officer contacts the head of the central hospital and organizes the medical care of the sick participants.

In the case of acute care that does not require immediate traumatological intervention, the Medical Imaging Clinic at Debrecen and Medical Imaging Department at Miskolc undertake to provide athletes with the possibility of performing an imaging examination within a short period of time. The examinations are coordinated by the co-chief medical officer. In these situations the examination must be paid for before it is performed.







Medical management on competition and training areas

The scope of services includes critical care, first-aid, as well as the general medical problems associagency assistant and a driver. On-duty personel at training events include one nurse with experience

5.8 SAFETY AND SECURITY

Safety and Security in the host cities

The safety and security of all the participants at the EUG 2024 is of extremely important to the Organizing Committee. Even though both host cities are safe and secure towns, please take good note of the following safety tips recommended by the OC. During EUG 2024, all security measures will be provided by the University security company (in Debrecen) and by a private security company (in Miskolc), both working in close cooperation with the (local) Police.

DEBRECEN-MISKOLC2024 FUROPFAN UNIVERSITIES

It is compulsory to wear accreditation cards during the competition and to comply with regulations in all establishment. Security Services will be provided in all the venues, for entrance control and to assure all participants' safety.

Safety in Accommodation

- The security guard is present in all accommodation facilities in case of emergency.
- Remember to always lock your room when you leave, even only for a few minutes.
- Only those who are officially staying in the accommodation are entitled to enter the accommodation. Do not facilitate access to strangers, the reception of guests is strictly prohibited.
- Never lend out your room or residence keys to anyone.
- Inform the accommodation staff of any lock defects or lost keys.

Safety on the street and public transport

- Both host cities are safe, nevertheless you are advised avoid walking alone at night in isolated areas.
- Be aware of your surroundings when walking outside, especially if you are listening to music on your headphones
 or talking on a mobile phone.
- Avoid taking your original passport and important documents with you (make copies and take them instead).
- Avoid exposing cash or expensive items. Do not leave laptops, notebooks, tablets or other valuable items unattended in common areas.
- Respect pedestrians walk lights and crosswalks.
- It is recommended to avoid conflict situations and to respect basic rules of conduct.
- When travelling by bus or tram, be aware of your surroundings and do not put valuable items into easily accessible pockets. Pickpocketing is not common in either of the cities, however it might happen occasionally.
- If you are the only passenger on a bus or tram, stay as close to the driver as possible. At night, when getting off the bus, pay particular attention to oncoming traffic.







Items prohibited at all venues

The restricted items policy applies to spectators and accredited individuals at the EUG 2024. Accredited athletes and team officials will be permitted to bring those items only into the venues that are required for specific disciplines.

Prohibited items will not be permitted into venues under any circumstances.

The list of prohibited items at venues is as follows:

- Firearms and ammunition and other devices used to discharge projectiles, devices which are deceptively like them devices, including replicas, component parts or any device resembling a firearm.
- Offensive weapons or implements such as flick knives and extendable batons, or anything that can be used to cause injury to another person.
- Stunning devices: devices specifically designed to stun or paralyse.
- Sharp-edged or pointed objects as they may cause serious injury.
- Knives and bladed items.
- Hand tools to cause serious injury or endanger the safety of participants.
- Laser pointers, strobe lights and similar light-emitting devices.
- Blunt instruments that can be used to cause serious injury by impact.
- Explosives, flammable substances, and incendiary devices which may be used to cause serious injury or endanger the safety of participants, and substances and devices which are deceptively like them.
- Fireworks, explosives, flares and smoke canisters.
- Sprays used to induce irritation or used for demonstrations: any device from which a substance can be sprayed to induce a non-aggressive state by irritation of the eyes, mucous membranes, or skin.
- Placards, spray paint or any other item which could be used for demonstrations or sabotage within a venue.
- Toxic and dangerous materials.
- Alcohol and intoxicating substances.
- Symbols of despotism.
- Pets or other animals.
- Professional recording and streaming equipment.
- All items of an excessive size that may disturb the event or restrict the view.

EUG 2024 Security reserves the right to refuse entry at its discretion of any item that appears suspicious.

Participants in EUG 2024 shall refrain from racial, ethnic, anti-religious, as well as political remarks and demonstrations.

Non-smoking and zero-alcohol policy

Smoking is strictly forbidden in all indoor venues in Hungary including accommodations and sport venues. Smoking is allowed at least 5 metres from all entrances.

Drinking alcoholic beverages is strictly forbidden in all venues of EUG 2024.















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5.9 SUSTAINABILITY

For the European Universities Games – and other sporting events – taking sustainability into account, integrating it into the organisational functioning and the planning and delivery of the Games is not only essential for the livelihoods of future generations, but also offers a wealth of opportunities. The need for change encourages innovative solutions that are beneficial not only for environmental, social and economic sustainability, but also for the development of the organisation and sport itself. Sporting events are not just limited to exciting competitions and achievements, but also provide an opportunity to highlight social issues and values, and thus to increase support for sport. By making the Games more sustainable and minimising its ecological footprint (waste production, energy and water consumption), the EUG can contribute to protecting the environment and combating climate change. By using sustainable purchasing practices, favouring local producers and environmentally friendly products, the event can support the local economy and promote sustainable production methods, and in the long term contribute to improving the health of society and deepening community relations. Sport, going beyond itself, can be a catalyst for desired change, as the EUG, like other similar sporting events, provides an excellent opportunity to pass on sustainability concerns and values, to experience fair play and social cohesion. The event can also encourage participants and contributors to be environmentally aware and socially responsible in their daily lives and in their future work. The European Universities Games can contribute to promoting sustainable lifestyles and positive social change.

In preparing and implementing the Sustainability Concept, we have taken into account the EUG goals, the UN Sustainable Development Goals, the circular economy model, national and international practices. Our approach is that prevention, minimalism (less is more), conscious consumption and the search for and choice of the most sustainable alternatives are essential to make the EUG more sustainable. Minimising material consumption is cost-effective, reduces pollution from unnecessary waste production and contributes to a more economical use of resources, maintaining a balance with nature.

6.5 ERASMUS+ MORE THAN GAMES PROJECT

The project, 'More than Games - Planning and implementation of the EUG 2024 Volunteer Program and Educational Side-Event Program' is realized in Erasmus+ Programme that supports not-for-profit European sport events. The project is co-financed by the European Union with 450 000 EUR grant. The main priorities are 'Volunteering in sport' and 'Education through sport'. Duration of the project is 12 months started in December 2023. The European Universities Games 2024 (EUG2024) will be organized between 12-24 July 2024 in two locations, Miskolc and Debrecen. For the event athletes from around 400 universities of 40 countries will arrive to compete in 17 different sports and the goal of the project is to implement a high quality the volunteer and side events programmes with the participation of about 900 volunteers. The beneficiary of the project is Hungarian University Sports Federation and 9 European sport associations participate as associated partners.

The project is implemented in 7 work packages, 2 of which focus on project management and coordination, as well as communication and dissemination, while 5 WPs focus on technical implementation that can be seen in the figure below.





27 different events support the implementation of the project, like project meetings, trainings, side events, promotional events, observer programs, workshops.



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6.6 OBSERVER PROGRAMME

The EUG2024 Observer Programme will take place from 11 to 15 July 2024 in Miskolc and Debrecen. The main goal of the Observer Programme is to provide first-hand experience regarding the organisational matters of the European Universities Games and a special opportunity to understand the scope, dimension, and complexity of the event in order to create a platform for learning, exchanging ideas and knowledge, and to network with EUSA staff and different stakeholders. Some of the objectives of this program is to provide a structured tailor-made program for future organizers to observe EUG time operations in full action, to offer guided visits, briefings, and round table discussions on specific EUG topics and to support and assist observers through allowing them to meet experienced staff to learn more about what questions and issues might come up and how to cope with them professionally with experience. This program is available for future organizers, candidate cities, European Universities Championships organizers, NUSA, sports organizations, and other multi-sport event organizers.



3. 3X3 BASKETBALL



3.1 HISTORY

General information

3x3 basketball is a fresh, modern, fast paced and very spectacular variation of full court basketball, played 3 on 3. In recent years it has gained enormous popularity. The game has been played in this format for a long time all over the world. The sport discipline started to become organized and got marketing background when one of the popular sporting goods manufacturers launched the Streetball competition series in the US in the early 90's. Ever since that time the number of 3x3 tournaments as well as the popularity of the sport discipline has been steadily growing. Since 2010 FIBA has considered 3x3 an independent event at world competitions. The discipline had gained such an impetus that it was included in the programme of the Olympic Games and had its debut in Tokyo 2020.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

In Hungary, 3x3 came strikingly into view besides traditional basketball 10 years ago. Hungary has become a very successful 3x3 nation over the sport's short history. At the FIBA 3x3 European Championships in 2016 Team Hungary won their first European championship title in the women's tournament with 100 percent performance, while one year later they pocketed the silver medal at the World Cup. The former outstanding basketball player, Dóra Kravjánszki-Medgyessy, born in Debrecen, was a part of both successes.

Debrecen relations / Local references

Debrecen is considered to be the stronghold of 3x3. In 2019 the city was home to the FIBA 3x3 Europe Cup, and it has also hosted the U18 Europe Cup three times and the FIBA 3x3 U18 World Cup four times. The 3x3 games at the EUG 2023 were also held in the city. The shining stars of the sport return to Debrecen as if they were coming home, since year by year the World Tour Series stop is staged in the main square of the city, in front of the iconic Great Church. Nothing better characterizes Debrecen's high-level organizational experience than the fact that FIBA awarded the city the right to organize one of the three OQTs, which will be held between May 16th and 19th, 2024.

3.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG 3x3 Basketball shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the International Basketball Federation (FIBA).

COMPETITIONS

<u>Team Tournament:</u>

- 1 (one) men's tournament, maximum of 24 (twenty-four) teams
- 1 (one) women's tournament, maximum of 20 (twenty) teams

Side tournaments:

- 1 (one) men's Dunk Contest
- 1 (one) men's Shoot-Out Contest
- 1 (one) women's Shoot-Out Contest

Side tournaments are non-compulsory for participating teams. Entries to these tournaments only are not allowed.





PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 4 (four) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 3 (three) and maximum 4 (four) athletes The head of the delegation must be appointed.

REFEREES

- OC shall provide referees in cooperation with EUSA and FIBA (referee clinic is organized).
- OC shall provide 2 (two) sets of polo shirts per referee.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA representative taking into account EUSA 3x3 Basketball ranking. The university team of the hosting city or in their absence the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

All teams have to bring 2 (two) different sets of uniforms, main colour light and the other dark. During the entire duration of the EUG competition each player must wear the same number.

- Women teams: 20

Competition Format

The competitions will be played in two (2) stages: the first stage will be played in groups (round robin system), and the second stage will be played in a play-off format system, set according to the respective sports regulations.

The teams placed 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 4^{th} in each group will qualify for the last 16, Quarter-Finals, Semi-Finals and Finals (places $1^{st} - 16^{th}$).

- Knock-out phase
 - The knock out phase start, with the last 16 games, The winners from the last 16 continue to the quarter finals, winners quarter finals continue to semi-finals, losers semi-final will play for the 3rd place and the winners will play for the first place.
- Pool & Final Standings Calculations
 - If teams that have reached the same stage of the competition are tied, the steps to break the tie shall be applied in the following order. Each step shall be calculated only once. If teams are still tied after one step, the next step shall be applied to break the tie between those teams still tied:
 - Most wins (or win ratio in case of unequal number of games in inter-pool comparison).
 - Head-to-head comparison (only taking win/loss into account and applies within a pool only).
 - Most points scored in average (without considering winning scores of forfeits), albeit considering never more than 21 points in each single game, irrespectively if score is above 21.
- Example
 - Team scores 22 points in game 1 and 18 points in game 2.
 - → Total score is 39 point (not 40) and average score is 19.5 points (not 20).

4. BADMINTON



4.1 HISTORY

General information

Badminton has a history of several thousand years. Among its numerous ancestors, we also record those of Chinese, Aztec, Greek and Roman origin. It is the "jeu volant" (flying toy) which can be considered the true predecessor of badminton in Europe, which was played mainly in princely courts from the 17th century. British military officers got to know the game in its present form under the name "poona" around 1860 in India, and introduced it in England.

Badminton has been an official Summer Olympic sport since the Olympics in 1992.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

In Hungary 1960 is considered to be the founding year of badminton. The Hungarian Physical Education and Sport Association recognised it as an official national sport discipline in 1966, and established the Badminton Committee of the Hungarian Tennis Association. The independent Hungarian Badminton Association was formed in 1969, which has been member of BWF since 1970 and that of BEC since 1973.

Debrecen relations / Local references

The development of badminton in Debrecen can be traced back to the early seventies. Thanks to delivering a conscious next gen programme, the country's largest and most successful badminton base soon emerged here. Csilla Fórián, Hungary's most successful badminton player of all time, who won 42 Hungarian Championship titles and participated at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, grew up in Debrecen. Gergely Krausz, also from Debrecen, was the first male Hungarian badminton player at the Olympics.

The most dominant badminton club of our days is the Pécs-based MultiAlarm SE, whose athletes regularly grab almost all Hungarian championship titles.

4.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Badminton shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the Badminton World Federation (BWF).

COMPETITIONS

<u>Team Tournament:</u>

- 1 (one) mixed team's tournament, maximum of 20 (twenty) teams
- Each match in team's tournament consist of: 1 (one) women's singles match, 1 (one) women's doubles match, 1 (one) men's singles match, 1 (one) men's doubles match, 1 (one) mixed doubles match

Individual Tournaments:

- 1 (one) men's single tournament (MS), maximum 64 (sixty-four) men
- 1 (one) women's single tournament (WS), maximum 64 (sixty-four) women
- 1 (one) men's double tournament (MD), maximum 64 (sixty-four) men's pairs
- 1 (one) women's double tournament (WD), maximum 64 (sixtyfour) women's pairs
- 1 (one) mixed double tournament (XD), maximum 64 (sixty-four) mixed pairs

Individual tournaments are compulsory for participating teams. Entries to these tournaments only are not allowed. The host country is allowed to enter one additional entry in each of the events (MS, WS, MD, WD, XD) if the entered players /Universities are not taking part in the Team Tournament. The players entered for doubles and mixed doubles events should be from the same University.





PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 6 (six) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held I (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

AN UNIVERSITIF

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 2 (two) and maximum 6 (six) women athletes, of minimum 2 (two) and maximum 6 (six) men athletes and maximum of 3 (three) officials. The head of the delegation must be appointed. Each delegation playing the team competition may enter the individual competitions with a maximum of 3 (three) men's singles, 3 (three) women's singles, 3 (three) men's doubles, 3 (three) women's doubles and 3 (three) mixed doubles.

DFFFDFFS

- OC shall provide referees in cooperation with Badminton Europe
- OC shall provide 2 (two) sets of polo shirts per referee.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams/athletes entered.

DRAW. SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA representative taking into account BWF, NSF (only individual tournaments) and EUSA Badminton ranking. The university team of the hosting city or in their absence the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

All teams participating in the team competition should have 2 (two) different unique team dresses in 2 (two) different colours (one in dark and one on light colours) with them. In the individual competitions doubles and mixed pairs should be dressed in the same colours. If players wear t-shirts with advertising, names or countries they have to respect.

Competition Format

The team competition will be played in two (2) stages: the first stage will be played in groups (round robin system), and the second stage will be played in a knock-out format system, set according to the respective sports regulations. Last group matches of the first stage, shall be played at the same time, whenever possible. Competition system (format) will be prepared in such a way, that competition concludes with matches for all final places (i.e. 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th, 13th, 15th, etc.). Taking part in conciliation tournament is compulsory.

The individual competition will be played in standard knock-out system in all five events (MS, WS, MD, WD, XD).

Ranking and Seeding

Team tournament ranking and seeding will be decided by EUSA and will be based on results from previous EUSA Games and EUSA Championships.

For the seeding in the team competition the teams will be divided according to their ranking into 5 seeding groups of 4 teams. Group 1 will hold the teams ranked 1 to 5, group 2 will hold the teams 6 to 10, etc. From each of these seeding groups 1 team will be drawn into 1 of the competition groups, so that at the end there will be 5 groups of 4 teams. For the second stage of the team competition there will be a draw for each of the KO draws with seeds only for the KO draw with group winners.

For the individual competition, seeding will be according to the valid BWF world ranking at the time of the draw which will be done on the day prior to the start of the individual competition.

Team's competition

 groups we will have:
 - → KO1 Places 1 to 5 (there are two bronze medals) KO2 Places 6 to 10 KO3 Places 11 to 15 KO4 Places 16 to 20

5. BASKETBALL



5.1 HISTORY

General information

Basketball has carved out a significant place as one of the world's most cherished and frequently watched sports, particularly shining in university sports. It boasts a rich array of skills, from adept ball control and sharp shooting to precise passing, effective defense, and grabbing rebounds. In the late 1800's, James Naismith conceived basketball as a team game that prioritized finesse over brute force, demanding keen eye-hand coordination. Initially, players aimed to score by tossing the ball into wicker baskets hung from balconies. Since its early days, basketball has been a cornerstone in EUSA competitions, shaping them into what they are today.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

The spread of basketball in Hungary is attributed to physical education teacher Géza Kuncze (dated back to 1912). He first encountered basketball being played in Germany during a course in Munich and became acquainted with its version without a backboard (korfball). The game first gained popularity in commercial schools where physical education teachers not only taught the game but also engaged in series of matches among themselves.

In 1921, a rulebook translated from German was issued, and in the 1920s, the first basketball departments were formed. At the Olympics, the Hungarian men's team appeared four times, finishing 16th in 1948, 9th in 1952, 9th in 1960, and 13th in 1964. The greatest success of the national team was winning the gold medal at the 1955 European Championship held at home.

The recognition of women basketball players came when two women were voted as the best player in Europe (Zsuzsa Boksay in 1982 and Ágnes Németh in 1985) in the annual poll organized by the Italian newspaper La Gazetta dello Sport.

Miskolc relations / Local references

Notable basketball teams and representatives related to Miskolc.

DVTK-Hun-Therm Miskolc (EuroCup Women's Team) is a professional women's basketball team based in Miskolc, Hungary. They compete in the Hungarian A Division.

MEAFC-Peka Bau Kosárlabda (NB I./B division) is a professional men's basketball team based in Miskolc, Hungary.

MEAFC-Miskolc focuses on developing young talent in basketball (U11 - U20 Teams)

Judit Medgyesi, a former national team player of DVTK, has played more than 200 times for the Hungarian national team. She was also a member of the Hungarian women's basketball team that finished 4th in the 1980 Moscow Olympics.

The European Universities Basketball Championship 2017 was held in the city of Miskolc, Hungary, with over 380 participants, representing 25 universities from 16 countries, and with 16 teams taking part in the men's competition, accompanied by 12 teams in the women's.





INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Basketball shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the International Basketball Federation (FIBA).

COMPETITIONS

PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 7 (seven) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 10 (ten) and maximum 12 (twelve) athletes and minimum of 1 (one) and maximum of 5 (five) officials. The head of the delegation and coach must be appointed.

REFEREES

The delegation shall include a referee with at least the highest national license; the relevant license of the National Basketball Federation must be submitted within the Quantitative entry deadline. Delegation failing to fulfil this obligation must pay 1.000 EUR to the Organizing Committee. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the OC without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided. OC shall provide 2 (two) sets of polo shirts per referee.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA representative taking into account EUSA Basketball ranking. The university team of the hosting city or in their absence the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

All teams have to bring 2 (two) different sets of uniforms, main colour light and the other dark and present both sets of equipment at the General Technical Meeting. During the entire duration of the EUG competition each player must wear the same number.



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General information

Beach handball is a dynamically developing, modern, speedy and enjoyable game, which you can learn while having fun.

Its history dates back to 1992. The version of handball played on sand, on the beach, the predecessor of today's beach handball, was developed by Italian coaches and referees. The first real breakthrough was in 1996, when the discipline was included in the Statutes of the European Handball Federation (EHF), and the first Rulebook was published by the International Handball Federation (IHF). The first beach handball seminar was held in Marsala (Italy) where the philosophy of the discipline was established and the EHF guidelines were issued.

Beach handball is included in the programme of the Paris Olympic Games as a demonstration sport in the form of an eight-team mini-tournament.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

The Hungarian Handball Federation introduced the game to those interested in the discipline in summer 1999. Beach handball made a successful debut and gained great popularity shortly.

Hungarian beach handball has a reputation on international level as well. After several podium places at European and World Championships, the men's national team of Hungary won its very first European Championship title in 2023.

The women's national team of Hungary won the gold medal at the 2013 and 2015 European Beach Handball Championships and took the silver medal at the 2014 Beach Handball World Championships. In 2016 Hungary hosted the World Championships where both teams made it to the final four.

Debrecen relations / Local references

Remarkable local references can not be mentioned yet, Beach Handball is currently seen as a future prospective sport at Debrecen University. We see EUG as an opprtunity to establish the basis for its potential development.

6.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Beach Handball shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the IHF and EHF (EHF Beach handball EURO regulations and IHF Rules of the Games Beach Handball).

COMPETITIONS

Team Tournament:

- I (one) men's tournament, maximum of 12 (twelve) teams
- 1 (one) women's tournament, maximum of 12 (twelve) teams

PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 3 (three) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 8 (eight) and maximum 12 (twelve) athletes and minimum of 1 (one) and maximum 4 (four) officials. One official (coach) must be appointed.

REFEREES

Referees and Delegates will be appointed by EHF (Beach Handball Commission) in cooperation with EUSA.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by the CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered.





DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done during the GTM in the cooperation between EUSA and EHF. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

Each team is required to have at 4 full team kit (80% has to be solid color, rule 4.8. IHF Beach Handball Rules of the Game) in different colors for their players (court players and goalkeeper/specialists). Sleeveless and close fitting tank tops and shorts are obligatory for men and sleeveless and close fitting body fit tank tops and short tight pants are obligatory for women (see IHF Beach Handball Rules of the Game – Athlete Uniform Regulations at the following link (page 94 and 95). For the matches of the EUG each player ´s number announced during GTM must be affixed on the back and front of the shirt of the respective player. During the entire duration of the EUG each player must wear the same number. The athletes number (of approx.12x10 cm fort the men's tank tops and 8x6 cm for the women's tops) must be placed on the front and back of the tops.

ATHLETES UNIFORMS

Athletes' uniforms and accessories contribute to helping athletes increase their performance as well as remain coherent with the sportive and attractive image of the sport.

This part of the rules provides all the details concerning uniform and accessory specifications with regards to color, style, quantity, fabric and branding, which all teams and organizers are expected to utilize.

The Competition Management (CM) must check each participating team's athletic uniforms during the Technical Meeting (TM) and during the event. All men's and women's athletic uniforms must correspond to the standards indicated hereunder. According to the Olympic Charter, religious, political and racial messages are strictly forbidden on athletic uniforms.

Men's tank top / Women's body fit tank top style The style of the tank tops / body fit tank tops must be in accordance with the graphics below. The men's tank tops and the women's body fit tank tops must be sleeveless and close fitting, and respect the space for the required branding. T-shirts that are worn under the team's official tank top are not allowed.

Color

Tank tops / body fit tank tops will be of bright and light colors (i.e. red, blue, yellow, green, orange and white) in the attempt to reflect the colors usually used and worn on the beach.

Branding

- Promoter's / sponsor logos: The promoter's/sponsor logos can be printed on the front and back of the men's tank tops and the women's body fit tank tops.
- Manufacturer's logo: The manufacturer's logo is printed on the front of the tank tops / body fit tank tops and must not exceed 20 cm2.

• Athlete's number

The athlete's number (of approx. 12x10 centimeters) must be placed on the front and back of the men's tank tops and the women's body fit tank tops. This information must be printed in a contrasting color to that of the tank top / body fit tank top (i.e. light on a dark tank top / body fit tank top, dark on a light tank top / body fit tank top).

• Men's and women's shorts style

- Team members must wear identical shorts. Male athletes must wear shorts as per the graphics below. The players' shorts, if not too baggy, can be longer but must remain 10 centimeters above the kneecap. Female athletes must wear short tight pants with a close fit that are in accordance with the graphics below.
- Teams are authorized to have sponsor logos (including manufacturer) on their shorts, located in any position and of any size.
- ightarrow There is no limitation in the number of the sponsors to be displayed on the shorts.
- → Athletes are required to print their name and nickname on their shorts/bottoms.
- The respective team officials must submit their own team's uniforms for approval during the pre-competition TM. T-shirts that are worn under the team's official tank top are not allowed.

• Uniform for cold weather

- During severe weather conditions, players will be allowed to use uniforms composed of tight shirt, long tight pants (down to the ankle and not to the knees). These must be consistent in style and color following the same marketing rules as for the players' shorts, regardless of size and position. The CM will be ultimately responsible to allow players to wear such a special uniform whenever will be required, after having consulted with the official medical staff.
- For the cold weather tank tops / body fit tank tops, sponsor logos are allowed on the cold weather gear for both men and women. For cold weather pants, sponsor logos are allowed both for men and women according to the general ruling, as stated above.





- Each team is required to have at 4 full team kit (80% has to be solid color, rule 4.8. IHF Beach Handball Rules of the Game) in different colors for their players (court players and goalkeeper/specialists). (see IHF Beach Handball rules of the Game Athlete Uniform Regulation).
- For the matches of the EUG each player's number (12x10 cm) announced during GTM must be affixed on the back and front of the shirt of the respective player. During the entire duration of the EUG each player must wear the same number.
- All teams are required to present all 4 playing kits at GTM as well as final delegation list (max 12 players and minimum 8 per team, plus maximum 4 officials).

Competition system (format) will be prepared in such a way, that competition concludes with matches for all final places (i.e. 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th, etc.).

Competition Program

We will have a maximum of three matches per day with a daily start at 09:00 and the last game preview at 18:00. Competition will be held following the EUSA document "Rules and Regulations for the European Universities Games 2024". The organization of the EUG Beach Handball shall be based on the most recent "Rules of the game" edition 3, October 2021 of International Handball Federation (IHF) and European Handball Federation (EHF).

- Points are awarded as follows
 - Win: 2 points
 - Loss: 0 points
- Periods are defined/awarded as follows
 - First half: win 1 period loss 0 periods
 - → Second half: win 1 period loss 0 periods
 - → Shoot-out: win 1 period loss 0 periods
- Goal points are awarded according to the official IHF Rules of the Game for Beach Handball.
- Teams are ranked by adding the points gained.
 - If, after completion of the group matches, two or more teams have gained the same number of points, the following ranking system will apply:
 - results in points between the teams concerned,
 - period difference in the matches between the teams concerned,
 - goal point difference in the matches between the teams concerned,
 - greater number of plus goal points in the matches between the teams concerned.
- If there is still a tie, the following system is used to decide between these teams, as long as the contested place is not the last place within the group:
 - → period difference is subtracted in all matches,
 - → greater number of plus periods in all matches,
 - goal point difference is subtracted in all matches,
 - greater number of plus goal points in all matches.
- If a ranking is still not possible, a draw shall decide. The EHF shall make the draw, if possible, in the presence of the persons being in charge of the teams concerned.

6.3.4 SPORT EQUIPMENT AND MATERIAL

Official balls - Trial

- The game is played with a round, non-slippery rubber ball. The men's ball weighs 350 to 370 grams and has a circumference of 54 to 56 centimeters; the women's ball weighs 280 to 300 grams and has a circumference of 50 to 52 centimeters. A smaller ball may be used for children's games.
- Prior to each game at least 4 regulation balls must be available. The 2 reserve balls should be kept in the middle behind each goal in a designated area and the 3rd reserve ball should be kept at the timekeeper's table.
- In order to minimize any playing time interruptions and avoid time-outs, the goalkeeper indicated by the referee should bring a replacement ball into the play as quickly as possible, when the ball has left the playing court.
- Towels are not provided in the sports facilities.
- Towels provided by the accommodation cannot be taken away from the location, therefore we ask all participants to bring and use their own towels during the sport activites according to their needs.
- Balls for trainings will be provided on site.

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BEACH VOLLEYBAL

7.1 HISTORY

General information

In 1915, a spirited group of friends took to a Hawaiian beach, where they outlined a playing area and rigged up a makeshift net. This marked the inaugural match of beach volleyball, a sport born out of leisurely gatherings and sunny beach days. Initially, it was mostly seen as a casual form of entertainment, capturing the hearts of enthusiasts primarily in the US. Beach volleyball is a unique team sport that is not only shaped by the dimensions of its court but also greatly influenced by the unpredictable and often challenging weather conditions found along coastlines. Players must adapt their strategies and techniques to contend with varying winds, sun glare, and even occasional rain, adding an extra layer of complexity to the game. By the 1980s, the growing popularity of beach volleyball led to the establishment of the first dedicated club, known as the "Santa Monica Beach Club." This marked a pivotal moment in the sport's evolution, as it began to formalize and gain more structured support.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

While Hungary might not be traditionally associated with beach volleyball compared to coastal countries, it has still made significant strides in developing the sport. Several beach volleyball clubs and facilities can be found across Hungary, particularly in cities with access to bodies of water such as Lake Balaton or the Danube River. Budapest, being the capital city, hosts various beach volleyball courts and tournaments during the summer season. The Hungarian Volleyball Federation oversees the organization of beach volleyball events and supports the development of the sport throughout the country.

Miskolc relations / Local references

While Miskolc itself may not have a direct historical connection to beach volleyball, the sport's global journey has touched many shores, including those of Hungary.

The biggest event so far was the 4th round of the Hungarian Beach Volleyball National Championship in July 2014. The event took place in Miskolc, City Hall Square, on a mobile court built for the event, which created a unique atmosphere. This is where the sport of beach volleyball was first introduced in Miskolc.

7.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Beach Volleyball shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB) and the European Volleyball Confederation (CEV).

COMPETITIONS

Team Tournament:

- 1 (one) men's tournament, maximum of 24 (twenty-four) teams
- 1 (one) women's tournament, maximum of 24 (twenty-four) teams

PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 5 (five) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held one day (1) prior to the start of the competition.





DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of 2 (two) athletes and maximum of 2 (two) officials. The head of the delegation must be appointed.

REFEREES

OC shall provide referees. The delegation may, at its own cost, include a referee with at least the highest national license, but preferably with an International (FIVB) qualification; a relevant license of the International/National Volleyball Federation must be submitted within the quantitative entry deadline. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the OC without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided. OC shall provide 2 (two) sets of polo shirts and 1 (one) white sun protection hat per referee.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA Representative taking into account FIVB and EUSA Beach Volleyball ranking. The university team of the hosting city or, in their absence, the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

Player's shirts: each player should at least get 2 (two) shirts, preferably in different colours for the competition from the OC. Normally, the semi-finalists and finalists get another 2 (two) shirts on the final day (one to play and one for the awarding ceremony). Player's shirts must be numbered "1" and "2". The numbers must be placed both on the chest and on the back of the shirt. The shirt cuts need to be tank top style shirt (men) and sport top style (women). Shirts are provided by the OC. Player's shorts/briefs: players of a given team must wear uniforms of the same colour and style according to tournament regulations.

8. CHESS



8.1 HISTORY

General information

Chess is considered to have originated in India, tracing its roots back to ancient times. Historical records suggest that the game was introduced to Persia in the 6th century. From there, its popularity spread across continents and cultures, finding a particularly warm reception in Europe during the medieval period. The Renaissance era marked a significant milestone for chess, as it saw the publication of the first instructional texts dedicated to the game. These early chess manuals not only taught the rules but also delved into strategic and tactical insights, contributing to the game's growing sophistication and appeal. A pivotal moment in chess history was in 1886 when the first official World Chess Championship match took place. The contenders were Johannes Zukertort, a Polish chess prodigy, and Wilhelm Steinitz, a Prague-born mastermind. After a hard-fought battle, Steinitz emerged victorious, securing the title and earning the distinction of becoming the inaugural world chess champion. This landmark event further elevated chess as a competitive and intellectually stimulating pursuit on the global stage.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

In Hungary, the organizational framework for chess was first established in 1839: this is when the Pest Chess Club was founded. The Hungarian Chess Federation was established in 1911.

An outstanding success for Hungarian chess is the Women's World Championship title held by Zsuzsa Polgár between 1996 and 1999.

Miskolc relations / Local references

If you're passionate about chess, Miskolc offers exciting opportunities to engage with fellow players and events!

Miskolc has hosted international chess tournaments. For example, there was a tournament with players of various levels, including Grandmasters and International Masters.

In 2008, a prestigious rapid chess match took place in Miskolc between Hungarian Grandmaster Péter Lékó and Norwegian challenger Magnus Carlsen. The event garnered attention and excitement from chess enthusiasts.

Chess clubs play a crucial role in promoting chess in Miskolc. currently there are two clubs where you can play chess. One is the "Miskolci Kisbocsok Egyesülete", led by Attila Vanczák; they work with a lot of youngsters. The other is the chess department of DVTK, where roughly sixty players play chess. There are also chess clubs in schools, which are attended regularly by about another hundred children. Miskolc's competitors hold numerous national and county championship titles. They generally finish in the top five in Hungarian competitions as teams.

8.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Chess shall be mainly based on the most recent Chess Rapid & Blitz Technical Regulations of the World Chess Federation (FIDE) and European Chess Union (ECU).

COMPETITIONS

Team Tournament:

- 1 (one) rapid open team tournament
- 1 (one) blitz open team tournament
- 1 (one) women rapid team tournament
- 1 (one) women blitz team tournament

Every match in the men's and women's competition shall be played over two boards. The players in each team must be listed in a fixed board order by their HoD. Entries to only one tournament are not allowed.





PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 4 (four) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of 2 (two) athletes and maximum of 2 (two) officials. The head of the delegation must be appointed. Individual entries are not possible. Universities can participate with more than 1 (one) team.

REFEREES

OC shall provide referees.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be Swiss system. Time Control in Rapid: 25 (twenty-five) minutes for all moves with an increment of 10 (ten) seconds per move, starting from move 1 (one). Time Control in Blitz: 3 (three) minutes followed by an increment of 2 (two) sec/move, starting from the move 1 (one). The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA Representative taking into account FIDE and EUSA Chess ranking.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

9.1 HISTORY

General information

Football enjoys incredible popularity all around the world. According to the data issued by the International Football Association (FIFA) football is regularly played by more than 240 million people in more than 200 countries worldwide, while at the weekends millions follow the games live at stadiums or on TV. A rudimentary ancestor of the game was played in China B.C. and it also appeared in Central-Mexico and the ancient Rome. This latter might most probably be the distant predecessor of football. Several variations showed up in Medieval Europe, Florentines and Indians also played the game's ancestors. The basis of the modern rules was laid in the middle of the 19th century. It was that time when rugby and football were separated. The Cambridge rules were written down in 1848 at the University of Cambridge where the later system was developed in details. FIFA was founded in 1904 and became the leading international organization of football. World Championships (FIFA) and European Championships (UEFA) are held every four years alike. Football was on the programme of nearly all summer Olympic Games.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

The sport discipline appeared prominently in Hungary at the end of the 19th century and at the beginning of the 20th century, the historic Hungarian football clubs began to be formed one after the other. Soon after that the newspapers of the time could report about excellent results.

Between 1938 and 1968 the men's national team of Hungary became Olympic Champion three times and won the silver medal at the Wor-Id Cups twice. In November, 1953 the Hungarian Golden Team defeated England, then considered to be unbeatable, 6:3 at "The Match of the Century" in the Wembley Stadium. The name of Ferenc Puskás (nicknamed Puskás Öcsi), the captain of the Golden team, the very best Hungarian football player of all times is known among football lovers all over the world.

Football fever grips Hungary again these days, since Hungary national team qualified for the 2024 European Cup after 2016 and 2020. In addition, in the person of Dominik Szoboszlai the team can also boast of a footballer who plays for the Premier League's top team (Liverpool).

With regard to the club teams, Ferencváros, which is the most popular and one of the most successful football teams in the country achieves significant international successes (e.g.: Champions League) nowadays.

Debrecen relations / Local references

Debrecen's favourite, the DVSC, founded in 1902, was also in the Champions League group round in the 2009-2010 season. In their history the red'n white team has won the Hungarian Championship seven times and the Hungarian Cup six times. Their home games are played in the state-of-the-art Nagyerdei Stadium, inaugurated in 2014, which can be found in an amazing forest environment.

The popularity of football in Debrecen is also proven by the fact that Hungary's most popular rock band, Tankcsapda (also from the city), wrote their own anthem for the red and white team, which you can hear from the young and the old alike in the city. Furthermore hundreds of children acquire the skills of playing the game at one of the country's most prominent youth football academy.

At the University of Debrecen (in addition to the institution's third-class team, the DEAC), the traditions of football history are nurtured in a series of lectures and various courses. The university can also be credited with the publication of a five-volume gap filling book, on the 3800 pages of which the author trio - historian-economist Éva B. Bába, sports journa-list-football historian Tamás Dénes, and sports historian Mihály Sándor - provides an overview about the football history across the world.



9.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Football shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the International Football Federation (FIFA) and the Union of European Football Associations (UEFA).

COMPETITIONS

Team Tournament:

- I (one) men's football 11's tournament, maximum of 16 (sixteen) teams
- 1 (one) women's football 7's, maximum of 12 (twelve) teams

PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 7 (seven) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The men's delegation will consist of minimum 14 (fourteen) and maximum 20 (twenty) athletes and minimum of 1 (one) and maximum of 5 (five) officials. The women's delegation will consist of minimum 10 (ten) and maximum 14 (fourteen) athletes and minimum of 1 (one) and maximum of 4 (four) officials. The head of the delegation and coach must be appointed.

REFEREES

The delegation in men's tournament shall include a referee (not assistant referee) and in women's tournament may include a referee (not assistant referee) with at least the highest national license; the relevant license of the National Football Federation must be submitted within the Quantitative entry deadline. Men's delegation failing to fulfil this obligation must pay 1.000 EUR to the Organizing Committee. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the OC without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered. Playing time men competition: 35 (thirty-five) minutes, only final may be 45 (forty-five) minutes; playing time women competition: 25 (twenty-five) minutes, only final may be 30 (thirty) minutes.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA Representative taking into account EUSA Football ranking. The university team of the hosting city or, in their absence, the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

Each team shall bring 2 (two) sets of player's match kit (shirt, shorts and socks) in different colours (noticeably different in contrast and colours, preferable in light and dark) and present both sets of equipment at the General Technical Meeting. Each player must use the same shirt number for the whole competition, and it shall be printed on the shirt in accordance with the FIFA Laws of the Game. In addition, teams shall bring two sets of bibs in different "untypical" (non-common colours used for match kit) colours (different from the match kit colours). During the entire duration of the EUG competition each player must wear the same number.

Competition Format

The competitions will be played in two (2) stages: the first stage will be played in groups (round robin system), and the second stage will be played in a knock-out format system, set according to the respective sports regulations.

Competition system (format) will be prepared in such a way, that competition concludes with matches for all final places (i.e. 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th, 13th, 15th, etc.). Taking part in conciliation tournament is compulsory.

Men's competition (11v11)

- Men's competition is played in two phases: group stages and knock-out rounds. Group stages consist of 4 groups of 4 teams each (round robin system). The 1st and 2nd places of each group qualify for next round for places 1-8. The remaining teams will play for places 9-16.
- Pointing System:
 - 3 points for a win 1 point each team for tie 0 points for a defeat

Women's competition (7v7 format)

- The first two teams of each group will play for places 1-4. The 3rd and 4th will play for places 5-8. The last team of each group will play for places 9-10.
- → Pointing System:
 - 3 points for a win 1 point each team for tie 0 points for a defeat,
 - Knock-out stage, Quarter finals, Semi-finals, Final and final places attribution,
 - The duration of all matches is 25 minutes per half, only final may be 30 minutes,

Ranking and Seeding (For both Men and Women)

 - greater number of goals scored in all group matches,
 - drawing of lots by the Competition Commission,
 - should more than two teams have the same number of points, the criteria listed above apply.



10. FUTSAL



10.1 HISTORY

General information

The origin of futsal can be traced back to Uruguay, where in 1930 a physical education teacher, a certain Juan Carlos Ceriani, "brought" football indoors in order to avoid adverse weather conditions, thus creating the 4+1 version of football. The game was played on a basketball court without the backboards. This variation of the game has existed in Brazil for more than 70 years, where among others Rivelino, Zico, Socrates, Ronaldo and Ronaldinho already used to play it as a kid.

The first FIFA Futsal World Championship was staged in 1989, and since 1992 the tournament has been held every four years.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

The discipline's operation has been going on in organized form in Hungary since 1989 under the auspices of the Hungarian Football Association (MLSZ). Hungary took the fifth place at the first World Championships, in spite of it there were no spring-autumn system national championships until the 1997-98 season, when the organized Hungarian futsal championships kicked-off with the games of 16 first- and 15 second-division teams. Since 2005 the men's (later that of the women) team of Hungary could participate at several European Championships. Hungary's most successful club is Rába ETO, which has won the national championship title eight times, and participated at international cups as well.

Debrecen relations / Local references

The sport discipline started to really boom in Debrecen in the second half of the 2000's. Nowadays, the city has both women's and men's elite futsal teams thanks to DEAC, the sports club of the University of Debrecen. The women's team is dominant in Hungary: they have won three national championship titles and three Hungarian Cups over the last three years.

10.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS AND EXCEPTIONS

The European Universities Games 2024 Futsal Tournament will be played in accordance to the current FIFA Futsal Laws of the Game and EUSA technical rules. If exceptions are made then they will be conveyed to each Head of Delegation during the General Technical Meeting on 9th of July 2024.

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF HEAD DELEGATION

Upon arrival at the playing court, the head of delegation must identify himself to the person in charge of the court and he/she will grant him access to the changing room.

We kindly ask for a proper use of the changing rooms, keeping in mind that they will be used by other teams. The head of delegation must fill in the relevant documentation for each game and deliver it to the match commissioner well in advance in order to let him do his/her job in optimum conditions. At the end of the game, the head of delegation must receive the relevant documentation, which will be delivered by the match commissioner or his assistant. Head of delegation must confirm the information in the match report by a signature. Once the team has finished using the changing rooms, the head of delegation must ensure the return of the changing room keys to the person in charge of the court.

REGULATIONS FOR TEAMS

The teams will not be able to occupy the court until the previous game has ended and the organization grants them access for warm-up. In case they wish to start the warmup earlier, they should ask the person in charge of the court for a place to do I if possible. The whole number of balls provided must be returned to the person in charge after the warm-up.

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COMPETITIONS

PROGRAM

11. HANDBALL



11.1 HISTORY

General information

Handball is a worldwide known, popular game. At the end of the 1800's and at the beginning of the 1900's, gymnastics was the dominant sport of the time. However, there was a demand for a new form of physical activity which would break with the strict rules of gymnastics, at the same time enjoyable and can be done by women as well. Around the turn of the century, three similar games developed: haandbold, torball and hazena.

Haandbold seems to have the most exciting story. The vision of the game can be traced back to the Danish schoolmaster Holger Nielson, who was fed up with the countless broken windows caused by students playing football, so he tried to create another ball game. His idea was a game in which the passes and the shots are more accurate, so the youngsters started to use their hands instead of their feet. The new game gained popularity within a short time in Denmark. The rules of the three games mentioned before were standardized in Germany by Karl Schelenz in 1917, that's how large-court handball spread. It became so popular that it had its debut at the Berlin Olympic Games in 1936.

In Scandinavia, after the Second World War to eliminate adverse weather conditions they started to play it indoors on a much smaller court. On the small court the game took up a faster pace, more goals were scored and tactics played a more important role as well. All of these together significantly increased the popularity of the sport.

Handball has always been included in the programme of the Olympics since 1972.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

Handball in Hungary was established by a Hungarian athlete, Sándor Cséfay. The Association of the Hungarian Handball Clubs was founded in 1933. Team Hungary's first ever competition took place at the 1936 Berlin Olympics. In 1938 they grabbed the bronze medal at the World Championship, while in 1949 the national team of Hungary won the gold medal at the large court Women's World Championship held in Budapest.

Hungarian handball is particularly successful at international level. At club level several Hungarian teams, e.g.: FTC, Budapesti Honvéd, Vasas, Debrecen, Dunaferr and Cornexi earned great reputation with various international cup victories. Both the men and the women national teams have already returned home with silver medals from World Championships, what's more, in Sydney 2000 the women became silver medallists at the Olympic Games, and were crowned European Champions in the same year.

Audi ETO KC from Győr is a world class handball team at club level of the latest era, which has won the Champions League six times since 2013. Regarding the men it is team Veszprém which has an outstanding performance and regularly fights in the Champions League Final Four.

Debrecen relations / Local references

Handball has huge traditions and a large fan base in Debrecen. Debreceni Dózsa men's team was crowned National Champion in 1975 with Varga, member of the team of the world, in its roster. DVSC Women handball team won the EHF Cup in 1995 and 1996, and belongs to the elite of Europe nowadays again. At the beginning of 2024, the team advanced from its main table group in the EHF Champions League, thus reaching to the 12 best teams in the continent. Many kids play handball in the city, and one of the country's youth academies is also based here.

COMPETITIONS

Team Tournament:

- 1 (one) women's tournament, maximum of 12 (twelve) teams.

DDOGDAM

The competitions consist of 6 (six) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held I (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

OPEAN UNIVERSITIE

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 10 (ten) and maximum 16 (sixteen) athletes and minimum of 1 (one) and maximum of 5 (five) officials. The head of the delegation and coach must be appointed.

DFFFDFFS

Referees will be appointed by EHF in cooperation with EUSA. Each delegation has to pay a refereeing fee in the amount of 300 EUR (three hundred euros) on the OC account.

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

Each team is required to have at least 1 (one) full team kit in light colours and one full team kit in dark colours (blue and red are considered dark colours) for the matches of the EUG. Goalkeepers' kit must differ from court players' kit in both light and dark colours kit options.

The team officials at the bench must wear distinguishable colour to opponent, all team officials must wear the same colour. Colours which may cause confusion with the court players of the opposing team are not allowed.

Each player's number announced during general technical meeting must be affixed on the back and front of the shirt of the respective player. The number must be clearly legible (in contrast colour to the shirt), must range from 1 (one) to 99 (ninetynine) and be at least 20 (twenty) cm high on the back and at least 10 (ten) cm high on the front. During the entire duration of the EUG competition each player must wear the same number.

Competition Format

The competitions will be played in two (2) stages: the first stage will be played in groups (round robin system), and the second stage will be played in a play-off format system, set according to the respective sports regulations. Last group matches of the first stage, shall be played at the same time, whenever possible. Competition system (format) will be prepared in such a way, that competition concludes with matches for all final places (i.e. 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th, 13th, 15th, etc.). Taking part in conciliation tournament is compulsory.

Preliminary round

The preliminary round is played in groups. The teams are divided in groups on the basis of the results of the draw conducted at the General Technical Meeting. The draw will be done in the presence of the EUSA Representative taking into account the EUSA Handball ranking. The university team of the hosting city or, in their absence, the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

• Preliminary round matches shall be evaluated as follows:

- Each match won = 2 points
 - Each match drawn = 1 point for each team
 - Each match lost = no points
- Teams are ranked according to the total number of points gained. If two or more teams have gained the same number of points after the group matches have been completed, classification is decided as follows:
 - Results in points between the teams concerned
 - ightarrow Goal differences in the matches between the teams concerned
 - ightarrow Greater number of plus goals in the matches between the teams concerned
- If the teams are still equal, a decision is made between those teams with equal number of points as follows:
 - → Goal difference is subtracted in all matches
 - → Greater number of plus goals in all matches
- If classification is still not possible, a draw shall decide. The EUSA representative on site shall execute the draw, if possible, in the presence of the "responsible team officials". If the 'responsible team official' cannot be present, other co-workers selected by the EUSA shall take part.





• Finals

After completion of the preliminary round, the finals shall be played in accordance with the knock-out system. If a game is tied at the end of the regular playing time and a winner has to be determined, an overtime is played, following a 5-minute break. The overtime period consists of 2 halves of 5 minutes, with a 1-minute halftime break. Should the match still not be decided after the overtime period, it is decided with 7 m penalty throws in accordance with Rule 2:2 of the Rules of the Game. EUSA has the right to decide that certain matches will be executed with direct 7m penalty throws in accordance with Rule 2:2 of the Game. If this rule applies, the decision will be published in the official announcement or together with the match schedule.

Rule 2:2 (IHF - Rules of the Game, page 8)

- Should the match still not be decided after the overtime period, the winner will be determined in accordance with the rules for the particular competition. In the case that the decision is to use 7-metre throws as tiebreaker to decide a winner, the procedures indicated below shall be followed. If 7-metre throws is used as a tiebreaker, players who are not suspended or disqualified at the end of the playing time are entitled to participate. Each team nominates 5 players. These players make one throw each, alternating with the players of the other team.
- The teams are not required to predetermine the sequence of their throwers. Goalkeepers may be freely chosen and substituted among the players eligible to participate. Players may participate in the 7-metre throws as both throwers and goalkeepers. The referees decide which goal is used. The referees make a coin toss, and the winning team chooses whether they wish to throw first or last. The opposite sequence is used for all subsequent throws, if the throwing has to continue because the score is still tied after the first five throws each. For such a continuation, each team shall again nominate five players. All or some of them may be the same as in the first round. This method of nominating five players at a time continues as long as it is necessary. However, the winner is now decided as soon as there is a goal difference after both teams have had the same number of throws. Players may be disqualified from further participation in the 7-metre throws in cases of significant or repeated unsportsmanlike conduct (16:6e). If this concerns a player who has just been nominated in a group of five throws wers, the team must nominate another thrower.

• Team-Time Out

According to Rule 2:10 and Clarification 3 of the Rules of the Game, each team has the right to receive a maximum of three team time-outs during regular playing time, but not during overtime. No more than two team time-outs may be granted in each half of the regular playing time. Between two team time-outs of a team, the opponent must be at least once in possession of the ball. 3 green cards, bearing numbers 1, 2, and 3 respectively, are available for each team. The teams receive cards bearing numbers '1' and '2' in the first half of the game and the cards no. 2 and no. 3 in the second half provided they received no more than one team time-out in the first half. In case they received two team time-outs in the first half, they receive only green card no. 3. Within the last 5 minutes of the regular playing time only one team time-out per team is allowed.

Special regulations for EUG 2024 Handball

- The half-time break is 10 minutes.
- If a game is tied at the end of the regular playing time in the placement matches for the position 1 to 4, only one overtime (2 x 5 min) will be used, and then, if necessary, a winner will be determined by using 7-meter throws according to the Rule 2:2.
- If a game is tied at the end of the regular playing time in the placement matches for the position 5 till 12 a winner will be determined immediately by using 7-meter-throws according to the Rule 2:2.
- The direct disqualification of a player or team official (red card) will be automatically connected (without disciplinary procedure) with disqualification for the next following match.
- The disqualification with report of player or team official (blue card) will be automatically connected (without disciplinary procedure) with disqualification for the next 2 following matches.





12.1 HISTORY

General information

Judo was founded by Jigoro Kano, evolving from the traditional Ju-jitsu he practiced. Kano refined techniques to create this new martial art. In judo, the aim is to throw, pin, or force an opponent to submit with joint locks or chokes. This blend of technique, strategy, and physical prowess has captivated practitioners and spectators alike since the sport's inception. Judo gained traction in the early 1900's, spreading to countries like the US, UK, France, Canada, Russia, and China. The International Judo Federation oversees the sport globally, with athletes competing in its professional circuit.

A significant milestone in judo's history came in 1964 when it was included as an official Olympic sport, further solidifying its status and introducing it to an even broader audience on the world stage.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

In 1906, at the invitation of Count Miklós Szemere, Master Sasaki Kichisaburo arrived in Hungary to introduce and popularize judo in our country. He began teaching with sixty students in his planned fourmonth course. By the end of the third month, only four remained. The master noted that "the Hungarian youth lacks enough perseverance," so he considered it possible that judo would not become established in Hungary. Regular judo instruction was started by Tibor Vincze in 1928, who is considered the father of Hungarian judo. The most prestigious achievement was reached by Antal Kovács when he won the Olympic title in Barcelona in 1992, and then a year later, in 1993, he won the first adult world championship title for Hungarian judo in Hamilton.

Miskolc relations / Local references

The world of Judo in Miskolc. MVSC, Borsodi Judo SE, Miskolci Judo Club, Miskolc Avas Judo SE, DVTK Judo Club.

Miskolc judo clubs offer self-defense training for all ages, from beginners to advanced levels. Judo emphasizes self-discipline, mental focus, and respect for oneself and others. Judo helps improve balance, coordination, and overall fitness. It's a martial art that focuses on control and technique rather than brute strength. Plus, it's a great way to burn calories-up to 700 per hour!

Szabina Gercsák, who was a member of the DVTK judo team, has transferred to Paks to Atomerőmű SE. She has achieved success at both European and World Championships at the age group level.

Miskolci Vasutas Sport Club (MVSC) within the framework of the railwaymen's club, established its Judo section in 1970. The golden era of Miskolci Judo dates back to 1971. Péter Braskó began his pioneering work as the only coach. The domestic success is evidenced by over 100 national championships and medal placements.

It is worth mentioning the name of Bertalan Hajtós, born in Miskolc in 1965, Olympic silver medallist (1992 Barcelona), World silver medallist (1993 Hamilton), two-time European gold medallist (1986 Belgrade, 1998 Oveido), who got acquainted with the sport in MVSC, then moved to Budapest to join Honvéd.

One of the MVSC's most successful athletes at the moment is Péter Sáfrány, the Club's World Junior Champion, who will be fighting for qualification for the upcoming Olympics.

12.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Judo shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the European Judo Union (EJU) and International Judo Federation (IJF).



COMPETITIONS

Individual Tournaments:

- Women individual categories: up to and including 48 kg, 48 to 52 kg, 52 to 57 kg, 57 to 63 kg, 63 to 70 kg, to 78 kg, over 78 kg,
- Men individual categories: up to and including 60 kg, 60 to 66 kg, 66 to 73 kg, 73 to 81 kg, 81 to 90 kg, 90 to 100 kg, over 100 kg.

OPEAN UNIVERSITIE

Team Tournament:

Teams can be composed of individuals from different universities and shall represent the respective NUSA.

The weight categories for the team tournament are as follows:

- Women (48 kg, 52 kg, 57 kg*) up to and including 57 kg,
- Men (60 kg, 66 kg, 73 kg*) up to and including 73 kg,
- Women (63 kg, 70 kg*) up to and including 70 kg,
- Men (81 kg, 90 kg*) up to and including 90 kg,
- Women (78 kg, +78 kg*) over 70 kg,
- Men (100 kg, +100 kg*) over 90 kg.

Athletes which are taking part in individual categories may register their participants for team tournament. Registration only to the team tournament is not possible.

PROGRAM

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of athletes and officials from their respective university. The head of the delegation must be appointed. Athlete shall have minimum brown belt. At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of athletes. Any entry not duly confirmed at the first General Technical Meeting, will not be taken into consideration except for force majeure.

In team tournament each team will consist of up to six (6) athletes (3 women and 3 men) and has the possibility to have up to four (4) reserves. If there are injuries or illness during the competition a team can compete with a minimum of four (4) athletes. A total of 10 athletes can be inscribed with a maximum of two (2) athletes per category.

REFEREES

OC shall provide referees in cooperation with EJU.

The delegation may, at its own cost, include a referee with at least the highest national license; the relevant license of the national Judo Federation must be submitted within the Quantitative entry deadline. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the Organizing Committee without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of athletes entered. The official weigh-in for each category will take place the day before the competition in each category. For the team tournaments there is 2 kg tolerance for athletes who competed in the individual Championships the day before the team weigh-in, while athletes who compete on the day on which the team weigh-in is scheduled do not need to weigh themselves (Categories: W: -70 kg, -78 kg, +78 kg; M: -81 kg, -90 kg, -100 kg, +100 kg). The random weigh-in will be organised before the first contests on each day (Start of random weigh-in 45 minutes before the start of the competition). There will be no random weighting for team events.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA Representative taking into account EUSA Judo, IJF and EJU ranking. The draw will be carried out by a software authorised by IJF. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

UNIFORMS

White and blue IJF approved judogi are obligatory and all competitors must have both types, with official IJF back number. All judogi must conform to the current regulations regarding size, materials etc., but it is not required that a judogi is purchased from the currently selected IJF manufacturers list of suppliers. The judogi and belt size will be controlled by sokuteiki.



13. KARATE



13.1 HISTORY

General information

Karate is believed to have its roots in kempo, a Japanese martial art with similarities to boxing. The term "karate" translates to "empty hand," emphasizing the use of the body as the primary weapon. Originating in Okinawa, the largest island in the Japanese archipelago, karate has evolved over time into a diverse and dynamic combat sport. Today, karate is primarily known for its striking techniques, which include punches, kicks, knee strikes, elbow strikes, and various open-hand techniques such as knife-hands, spear-hands, and palm-heel strikes. These striking techniques form the core of most karate styles and are essential components of training and competition. Over the years, karate has gained popularity not only in Japan but also around the world, with practitioners and enthusiasts embracing its diverse techniques, principles, and philosophies. Whether practiced for self-defense, fitness, or competition, karate continues to thrive as a respected martial art with a rich and storied history.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

The history of karate in Hungary began in 1972 when Attila Mészáros, a 2nd dan Kyokushin karate master living in Sweden, visited the training of the Judo department of College of Physical Education. His demonstration amazed the attendees. Particularly receptive were Kálmán Furkó and István Adámy, who – with the support of Ferenc Galla, head of the College of Physical Education combat sports department, and guidance from Attila Mészáros – laid the foundations of Kyokushin karate in Hungary.

The Hungarian Karate Federation is estimated to have a membership of 40,000 to 50,000 registered and recreational athletes. Hungary achieved its first European Championship title in 2022 by György Dániel, while Aicha Boussebaa, former World and European champion in the junior category, won the silver medal at the European Championships for adults.

PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 3 (three) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held one day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of athletes and officials from their respective university and athletes from different universities according to the regulation KAR 5. The head of the delegation must be appointed. Athletes shall have minimum 2nd Kyu in Kumite and minimum of 1st Dan in Kata.

TEAM COMPOSITON

Teams must be composed of individuals from the same university, with 1 (one) competitor allowed from different university belonging to the same NUSA, as follows:

- TEAM KATA MEN AND WOMEN: minimum 3 (three) and maximum 4 (four) registered competitors per team
 (1
 (one) competitor from different university is allowed);
- TEAM KUMITE WOMEN: minimum 2 (two) and maximum 4 (four) registered competitors per team (1 (one) competitor from different university is allowed if minimum 2 (two) from the same university are registered);
- TEAM KUMITE MEN: minimum 3 (three) and maximum 7 (seven) registered competitors per team (1 (one) competitor from different university is allowed if minimum 2 (two) from the same university are registered, and 2 (two) competitors from different university is allowed if minimum 4 (four) from the same university are registered).

All teams must be registered through the EUSA registration system until the end of the registration deadline. No onsite registrations will be accepted

REFEREES

Each NUSA that has registered one or more universities competing with a minimum of 4 (four) competitors is obliged to send at least one judge with an EKF license; the relevant EKF license must be submitted within the Quantitative entry deadline. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the Organizing Committee without charging a participation fee; a referee fee is not provided. Referees will be approved by the Technical Delegate in cooperation with the EKF Referee Commission according to the required quota and licenses. If the quota is not fullfilled, the OC will fill it with referees from the ranks of the national sports federation with a minimum title of the highest national rank.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of athletes entered. Only one weighting will be organized for the whole competition.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done at the GTM using WKF approved software, taking into account the last EUSA Championships. Teams and individual competitors who have won a medal at the last EUSA Championship will have seed places in the draw if they have not changed category.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

All karate gi (kimono and protections) must be World Karate Federation (WKF) approved. Teams can only have university marks on their karate gi. All other markings must be removed from the karate gi. Medal winners are required to come to the medal ceremony in karate gi. Coaches are required to wear uniforms in final matches.



14. KICKBOXING



14.1 HISTORY

General information

Kickboxing emerged by blending the techniques and principles of muay thai and karate, originating in the 1960's primarily in Japan. As the sport evolved, it caught the attention of American enthusiasts in the 1970's, leading to the development of a distinct American style known as "full-contact" kickboxing. In the full-contact variant, competitors are allowed to deliver punches and kicks to the head, adding an extra layer of intensity to the bouts. Kickboxing matches typically take place in a boxing ring, with participants wearing boxing gloves, mouthguards, and shorts, while opting for bare feet to facilitate powerful kicks. Kickboxing serves multiple purposes for practitioners, whether it's for self-defense, improving general fitness, or competing at various levels. Its dynamic nature and focus on striking techniques make it a popular choice among martial arts enthusiasts worldwide. In 1993, the Japanese introduced K-1, an organization dedicated to promoting kickboxing matches based on modified Japanese rules. Over the years, K-1 has established itself as the most prestigious kickboxing organization globally, showcasing top-tier talent and thrilling fights that captivate audiences around the world.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

In Hungary, the organization for kickboxing officially formed in 1979 through the establishment of the All-Style Sportkarate Branch within the Karate Section Committee. Athletes from the Hungarian Kickboxing Federation have been participating in World and European Championships since 1981.

At the World Championships, a total of 416 medals were won, and at the European Championships, a total of 426 medals were achieved. The recorders in universal kickboxing are Hungarians: Dezső Debreczeni, who has the most (7) individual world championship titles. Anna Kondár and Zsolt Mórádi are the athletes with the most world championship titles, both having won 10 world championship titles each, comprising 6 individual and 4 team world championship titles.

15. TABLE TENNIS / PARA TABLE TENNIS



15.1 HISTORY

General information

Table tennis has a long history, according to some sources, a game very similar to today's table tennis was known and played in contemporary Europe as early as the 12th century. Its current form appeared in England in the 19th century where it was initially regarded as a leisure activity.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

In the early days Hungary was considered to be a table tennis powerhouse. The most successful player of the discipline is still Viktor Barna, who won 22 World Championship titles between 1929 and 1954.

Debrecen relations / Local references

The game appeared in organized form in Debrecen in the first half of the 20th century. Thanks to the large-scale investment support of the Debrecen University, a state-of-the-art table tennis hall was installed in the Nagyerdei Stadium in 2018, thus boosting the youth and adult table tennis life in Debrecen again. Debrecen also has a first-league men's and women's table tennis team called DEAC-DAK.

15.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Table Tennis and Para Table Tennis shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF).

COMPETITIONS

<u>Team Tournaments:</u>

- I (one) men's tournament, maximum of 20 (twenty) teams,

- Each match consists of single matches only.

- one (1) women's para single Class 1-5 and Class 6-10 tournament, no restriction concerning the number of athletes with disabilities,
- I (one) men's double tournament (MD), maximum 64 (sixty-four) men's pairs,
- 1 (one) women's double tournament (WD), maximum 64 (sixty-four) women's pairs.
- Teams which are taking part in team competitions may register their participants for individual competitions
- Registration only to the individual competitions is not possible.

Singles tournament (Para Table Tennis only):

- 1 (one) men's tournament, Class 1-5 and Class 6-10 tournament, norestriction concerning the number of athletes with disabilities,
- I (one) women's tournament, Class 1-5 and Class 6-10 tournament, no restriction concerning the number of athletes with disabilities,

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PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 5 (five) days, competitions for para table tennis consist of 3 (three) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 3 (three) and maximum 5 (five) athletes and maximum of 2 (two) officials (a personal assistant to a person with disabilities does not count in the quota of officials) only students with disabilities can register individually. The head of the delegation must be appointed.

REFEREES

- OC shall provide referees.
- OC shall provide 2 (two) sets of polo shirts per referee.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournaments will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams/ athletes entered.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA Representative taking into account ITTF (only individual tournaments) and EUSA Table Tennis ranking for the team events. The university team of the hosting city or, in their absence, the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

Playing clothing shall comply with ITTF rules § 3.2.2. Any question of the legality or acceptability or of playing clothing shall be decided by the referee.

CLASSIFICATION

Table Tennis players with disabilities who are not internationally classified will have to access the classification one (1) day before competition scheduled by organizers. The Para Table Tennis competition will only be held in each category if at least 4 competitors per category are registered, otherwise the classes will be merged (1-5 and 6-10).

16. TAEKWONDO



16.1 HISTORY

General information

Taekwondo has deep roots in the history and culture of Korea, tracing back to as early as the 1st century BC with a martial art known as Taekkyeon. This ancient form served as a foundational precursor to the modern version of taekwondo that we recognize today. Taekwondo is characterized by dynamic punching and kicking techniques, with a particular emphasis on high kicks, spinning jump kicks, and rapid kicking combinations. Competitively, taekwondo offers two main formats: Poomsae, which focuses on form and technique, and Kyorugi, which is a sparring competition. Both formats showcase the diverse range of techniques and skills that taekwondo practitioners can master.

The electronic protector and scoring system (PSS) was developed and introduced in order to achieve better objectivity, fairness and transparency in scoring process. Today, taekwondo is practiced by an estimated 80 million people in 209 countries, administered by five Continental Unions - making it one of the world's most popular sports.

Taekwondo's global appeal and competitive spirit led to its inclusion as an official Olympic sport in the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games, further elevating its status and introducing it to a worldwide audience on the Olympic stage.

With increasing number of the European student competitors, taekwondo was included within EUSA Program since 2009. Since 2022, Taekwondo competitions within European Universities Games (EUG) are recognized by World Taekwondo as a "WT GI event". Hence, participating Taekwondo athletes are required to submit the information concerning their "WT GAL Licence".

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

Taekwondo was founded in Hungary in 1977 by László Harmat (ITF). The Olympic WTF Taekwondo could only started to operate after the regime change in 1989. Its founder, grandmaster Miklós Patakfalvy, is the national TD of the EUSA Games 2024 Taekwondo.

The organisation first became a member of the Hungarian All-Martial Arts Federation under the name of WTF Taekwondo committee, and since 1990 it has operated as an independent national sports federation (Hungarian Taekwondo Federation - MTKDSZ).

The MTKDSZ became an official member of the WTF in 1989 and of the European Taekwondo Union (ETU) in 1990.

As a member of the Hungarian Olympic team in Sydney in 2000, Josef Salim (58 kg), and in 2021 at the Tokyo Olympics 2020, his nephew Omar Gergely Salim (58 kg), both achived 5th place.

Hungary will be represented at the Paris Olympic Taekwondo competitions by 3 competitors, Mr. Omar Gergely Salim (58 kg), Mr. Józsa Levente (68 kg) and Ms. Viviana Márton (67 kg).

Miskolc relations / Local references

The world of taekwondo in Miskolc.

16.2 RULES & REGULATIONS

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Taekwondo shall be mainly based on the latest Technical Regulations of the World Taekwondo Europe (WTE) and the World Taekwondo (WT).

PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 3 (three) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held I (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of athletes and officials from their respective university. The head of the delegation and coach must be appointed. Athletes shall have minimum black belt certificate, issued by Kukkiwon or national taekwondo federations.

REFEREES

OC shall provide International referees in cooperation with EUSA TD and WT Europe. Appointment of Referee chairman and referees are approved by EUSA TD. The delegation may, at its own cost, include a referee with at least the highest national license; the relevant license of the national taekwondo federation must be submitted within the Quantitative entry deadline. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the Organizing Committee without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of athletes entered.

DRAW. SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA Representative taking into account EUSA taekwondo, WT and WTE ranking.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

Scoring Criteria of FSP

- The types of foot techniques designated by WT Poomsae Committee are as follows: Heights of jump Side kick (in case of pair and team division, entire team members must perform this technique)

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- Number of kicks in a jump: Front kick (at least one member of the team must perform this technique)
- Gradient of spins in a spin kick: Spinning hook kick or turning kick (at least one member of the team must perform this technique)
- Performance level of consecutive kicks: Kyorugi style kick (at least one member of the team must perform this technique) *3~5 bouncing steps is mandatory before executing the Kyorugi style kicks.
- Acrobatic actions: Any acrobatic action performance with TKD style kick(s) (at least one member of the team
 must perform this technique). TKD kick (s) must be performed with the knee extension (example: Apchagi).
 Point shall be awarded only if athletes perform the techniques in the above order.
- All of the following stances must be included in the performance at least once:
 - Dwitkubi (Backward inflection stance)
 - → Beom-seogi (Tiger stance)
 - → Hakdari-seogi (Crane stance)

17. TENNIS



17.1 HISTORY

General information

The origins of tennis-like games can be traced back to antiquity, with early versions of the sport being played across different cultures. However, modern tennis as we know it today emerged in the 19th century, evolving from its predecessors like real tennis or royal tennis. The sport we now simply refer to as tennis originates from Edgbaston, Birmingham, England, initially known as lawn tennis. This version of the game gradually gained popularity and eventually became the predominant form of tennis played worldwide. Real tennis, with its more intricate rules and historical roots, continues to exist as a distinct and specialized sport. As tennis gained momentum, organized tournaments began to emerge, some of which have stood the test of time and remain highly prestigious today. The four major Grand Slam tournaments are the Australian Open, Roland Garros (French Open), Wimbledon, and the US Open. Among these, Wimbledon holds the distinction of being the oldest, with its inaugural tournament taking place in 1877. These Grand Slam events attract the world's top tennis players and captivate audiences globally, showcasing the sport's competitive spirit, athleticism, and rich history on some of the most iconic stages in the world of sports.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

In Hungary, the first steps towards establishing an independent Tennis Federation were taken in 1905 by the Hungarian Athletic Federation, which decided to establish a lawn tennis subdivision. Hungarian tennis achieved its most outstanding results after World War II when the team (Szabolcs Baranyi, Péter Szőke, Balázs Taróczy) won the King's Cup in 1976. The team reached the semifinals of the European group of the Davis Cup four times. In 1994, Hungary entered the Davis Cup World Group for the first time in its history. One of Hungary's most well-known tennis players today is Márton Fucsovics, who is a two-time junior Grand Slam champion and junior world number one (2010). He has won the Hungarian National Championship eight times and earned a team gold medal at the European Championships. The current No. 1 Hungarian player is Fábián Marozsán.

Miskolc relations / Local references

Tennis in the beautiful city of Miskolc!

The MVSC Sport Complex, supported by the Hungarian State Railways, was built in 1931 and included six tennis courts.

In Miskolc, there are many opportunities for tennis, including the University of Miskolc's recently renewed tennis centre, where trainings for students is also taking place.

In addition, there are many facilities for practising the game:

- Miskolc-Tapolca Park Hotel has a clay tennis court.
- The Junior Tennis Park in Győri kapu offers tennis to the residents of the city centre
- Top Court Sportcentrum in Miskolc offers tennis facilities.
- Pünkösdhegyi Tenisz és Szabadidő Központ is also a popular tennis court in Miskolc.

The university team of the hosting city or, in their absence, the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

18. VOLLEYBALL



18.1 HISTORY

General information

Volleyball holds a prominent position as one of the most widely played and beloved team sports across the globe. The credit for its inception goes to William G. Morgan, a physical education teacher from Massachusetts. The inaugural demonstration of volleyball took place on February 9, 1895, marking the beginning of a sport that would captivate people of all ages and backgrounds. It's common to find students enthusiastically playing the sport, and many city-based volleyball clubs often have strong ties to local universities. The game's straightforward rules, coupled with its fast-paced and dynamic nature, make it accessible and appealing to both players and spectators alike. Its universal availability and relatively low costs make it accessible to people from all walks of life, contributing to its widespread appeal. The global reach of volleyball was further solidified with the establishment of the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB) in 1947 during a congress held in Paris. This paved the way for the first Men's World Championships in 1949, followed by the Women's World Championships in 1952. In 1964, volleyball achieved another milestone by becoming an official Olympic sport, allowing it to showcase its competitive spirit and athleticism on the world's biggest stage.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

Hungarian volleyball roots date back to a long time ago. Primarily, professionals from neighboring countries, especially from Poland, introduced the sport firsthand, which started spreading first in schools in the 1940's, and later through departments.

The Hungarian Volleyball Federation was founded in 1946. The women's national team won silver medal at the European Championship in 1975. Additionally, they have won the bronze medal three times at the European Championships. Their best placements at the Olympic Games were fourth place achieved in 1976 and 1980. The men's national team won bronze medal at the European Championship in 1950 and finished second in the continental tournament in 1963. Their best placement at the Olympic Games was sixth place in 1964. The best result at the World Championships was fifth place, achieved in 1952.

Miskolc relations / Local references

Miskolc Volleyball Overview.

- Miskolci VSC (MVSC): This is a volleyball club based in Miskolc, Hungary, founded in 1911. The women's volleyball team has a history of almost half a century. The club has also participated in the Hungarian top league, the Extraliga.
- MEAFC was founded in 1951 at the University of Miskolc. The men's volleyball team of MEAFC-Miskolc, later MEAFC-Peka Bau, has been competing in the Hungarian championship, the Hungarian Cup, for about a decade and a half, and has spent the last year in the Extraliga.
- DVTK's women's volleyball team is trying to gain a foothold in the Extraliga.

The organization of the EUG Volleyball shall be mainly based on the most recent Technical Regulations of the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB) and the European Volleyball Confederation (CEV).

COMPETITIONS

Team Tournaments:

- 1 (one) men's tournament, maximum of 12 (twelve) teams,
- 1 (one) women's tournament, maximum of 16 (sixteen) teams.





PROGRAM

The competitions consist of 7 (seven) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 10 (ten) and maximum 14 (fourteen) athletes and minimum of 1 (one) and maximum of 5 (five) officials. A team composed by 14 (fourteen) athletes has to appoint 2 (two) libero, a team composed of 13 (thirteen) athletes has to appoint minimum 1 (one) libero, a team composed of 10 (ten), 11 (eleven) or 12 (twelve) athletes is allowed to appoint up to 2 (two) libero but doesn't have to play with libero. The head of the delegation and coach must be appointed.

REFEREES

The delegation shall include a referee with at least the highest national license; a relevant license of the National Volleyball Federation must be within the Quantitative entry deadline. Delegation failing to fulfil this obligation must pay 1.000 EUR to the Organizing Committee. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the OC without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided. OC shall provide 2 (two) sets of polo shirts per referee; referees shall bring own long dark colour trousers.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA representative taking into account EUSA Volleyball ranking. The university team of the hosting city, or in their absence, the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations.

UNIFORMS

Each team is required to have at least 2 (two) different sets of uniforms, one with main colour light and the other with main color dark. Uniform consists of a jersey (shirt), short, training suit, and must be the same for the whole team. The libero has to wear the same uniform in a different and contrasting colour and must be numbered.

Player equipment (accessories) consists of shoes, knee-guards, ankle supporters and elbow protections. Sleeves for legs and arms have to be in the main colour of the shirt in accordance with FIVB Event Regulations.

The competitor equipment and uniforms must follow the CEU 1, CEU 2 and CEU 3 of the EUSA Rules and Regulations.

All letters and numbers on the player uniforms must be in contrasting colours to the part of the uniform where they are placed. Numbers have to be placed on the front and back side of jerseys in accordance with FIVB Event Regulations, and must range from 1 (one) to 99 (ninety-nine). During the entire duration of the EUG competition each player must wear the same number. The competition uniforms' colours and players numbers must be presented to the CC, according to REG 90.1 of the EUSA Rules and Regulations.



19. WATER POLO



19.1 HISTORY

General information

Water polo, a dynamic and challenging team sport played in water, was founded in Great Britain at the close of the 19th century, specifically in Scotland. The early days of the sport saw its development take shape in Glasgow, with initial training sessions held in local swimming pools. William Wilson is credited with formalizing the rules of water polo in 1876, laying the groundwork for the sport as we know it today. Water polo made its Olympic debut in 1900, initially featuring exclusively men's teams. It wasn't until the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games that women's water polo was introduced to the Olympic program, marking a significant step towards gender equality in the sport. The ongoing growth and development of water polo on a global scale are overseen by the World Swimming Federation (World Aquatics). As the governing body for aquatic sports, World Aquatics plays a crucial role in promoting and regulating water polo, ensuring that the sport continues to thrive and evolve both at the competitive level and in grassroots participation worldwide.

Hungarian aspect and prominent representatives

Water polo is Hungary's most successful team sport. In addition to our men's national team's nine Olympic gold medals, we also boast three World Championship titles and thirteen European Championship titles. Our women's team has won the World Championship twice and the European Championship three times. Water polo is considered a "national" sport in our country. The Hungarian Water Polo Federation, comprising more than 170 clubs, is a highly beneficial organization dedicated to advancing the sport locally. efore 1989, it was part of the Hungarian Swimming Federation, but since then, it has operated as an independent entity, contributing to the promotion of water polo in Hungary.

Miskolc relations / Local references

The European Universities Water Polo Championship in 2023 was held in Miskolc. Over 130 participants from 7 Universities from 3 countries took part in this event. It was a remarkable celebration of athleticism, fair play, and excellence. The first four places were secured by Hungarian universities.

Clubs Related to Miskolc:

- Miskolci Vizilabda Club (MVLC) is a notable water polo club based in Miskolc, Hungary. The team competes in the National Championships 1st class.
- The MVLC was founded on April 27, 2012, the club considers youth development to be a key priority. The club's successes began to show prominently in 2014, with the first milestone being the final of the youth Komjádi Cup, where the team won the silver medal. Subsequently, the team's journey in the OB I/B league continued until they were promoted to the top division. The club is currently a stable member of the OB I field.
- It is also worth mentioning that the University of Miskolc sports club (MEAFC) also has a water polo department, where they focus on youth education in addition to students sports.

Péter Biros a true legend in the waterpolo sport and have brought recognition to Miskolc. He was born in Miskolc and his remarkable career in water polo spans several Olympic Games and other prestigious events.

- Olympic Success:
 - Biros played a crucial role in Hungary's water polo dominance during the early 2000's.
 - At the 2000 Sydney Olympics, Hungary secured its first Olympic medal in 24 years by winning gold.
 - In the 2004 Athens Olympics, Hungary defended their title with a thrilling come-from-behind victory over Serbia-Montenegro (8-7).
 - The 2008 Beijing Olympics saw Hungary face off against the surprising USA team. In a wild shootout, the Magyars emerged victorious with a score of 14-10.

This win in 2008 gave Hungary an unprecedented third consecutive Olympic gold medal. Péter Biros was one of only six male athletes who won three Olympic gold medals in water polo.

INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The EUG Miskolc 2024 will be played according to the latest regulations approved by World Aquatics. The preliminary round is played in one group.

COMPETITIONS

Team Tournaments:

• 1 (one) men's tournament, maximum of 12 (twelve) teams

PROGRAM

The competition consists of 6 (six) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held 1 (one) day prior to the start of the competition.

DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of minimum 10 (ten) and maximum 13 (thirteen) athletes and minimum one (1) and maximum 4 (four) officials. The head of the delegation must be appointed.

REFEREES

OC shall provide referee. The delegation may, at its own cost, include a referee with at least the highest national license; the relevant license of the national water polo federation must be submitted within the Quantitative entry deadline. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the Organizing Committee without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided.

PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by CTC taking into consideration the number of teams entered.

DRAW, SEEDING

Draw procedure will be held in front of the team representatives during the GTM, in line with the competition system (format). Its details will be explained to the GTM audience. The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the EUSA TD and SCAC Representative. The results of the draw will be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.

The draw will be done in the presence of EUSA representative. The university team of the hosting city or in their absence the hosting country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in pool A. Teams from the same country shall, whenever possible, be placed in different pools.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In order to participate, all financial obligations towards EUSA and Organizing Committee need to be settled by the specified dates, as per EUSA Rules and Regulations

UNIFORMS

EUSA rules concerning players' swimsuits and caps are based on the World Aquatics rules for sports material, team equipment & advertising guidelines in the latest version. All letters and numbers (university code, player's numbers) on the player caps and warming up suits must be in Latin characters and must be in contrasting colours to the part of the uniform and/or warming up suit where they are placed. During the entire duration of the EUG competition each player must wear the same number.


19.3.3 COMPETITION FORMAT & SCHEDULE INFO

• Men teams: 8

Competition Format

The competitions will be played in two (2) stages: the first stage will be played in two group and the second stage will be played in a play-off format system, set according to the respective sports regulations. Competition system involves matches for all final places (i.e. 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th). Taking part in conciliation tournament is compulsory. In the second round, the play-offs will be played in group matches for the lower positions, and in semi-finals and finals for the 1-4 positions.

- Preliminary round matches shall be evaluated as follows
 - → Each match won = 3 points
 - Each match drawn = 1 point for each team
 - → Each match lost = no points
 - Teams are ranked according to the total number of points gained. If two or more teams have gained the same number of points after the matches have been completed, classification is decided as follows:
 - results in points between the teams concerned.
 - goal differences in the matches between the teams concerned.
 - greater number of plus goals in the matches between the teams concerned.
- In case of tie, the competition is following the World Aquatics rule book:
 - → No tie, after the game time, immediately penalty shoot out (5-5 players).
 - IMPORTANT: also following the WA penalty shootout procedure (APPENDIX 6 PENALTY SHOOT OUT)!
 - → Winner of the shoot out will receive 2 points, the loser gets 1 point.
 - If two teams shall have eqal points, further classification shall be established as follows (based on WA WP Rulebook):
 - If two (2) teams shall have equal points, further classification shall be established as follows:
 - The team winning the game between them (including penalty shoot-out if any) shall be placed higher.
 If there is more than one tie in a group, the highest placed tie shall be determined first.
 - If three (3) or more teams shall have equal points, further classification shall be established as follows:
 - → The results among the tied teams shall determine which team is placed highest.

- The comparison shall be made:
 - First, upon the points of the games among the tied teams.
 - Second, the goal difference (excluding the goals from penalty shoot- out) among the tied teams.
 - Third, based upon goals scored among tied teams.
- → If still tied, the games played against the highest placed team (or teams, if tied, the team or teams not involved in the tie) shall be considered. The first comparison shall be based on goal difference, and if still tied, then based on goals scored.
- → If still tied, the results against the next highest placed team (or teams, if tied) shall be used in succession until all results have been considered.
- ightarrow If still tied, and there is no practical manner to determine the ranking, the final classification between the teams in the tie shall be decided by coin-toss.
- If there is more than one tie in a group, the highest placed tie shall be determined first.
- For the purpose of calculating either goal difference or goals scored, the goals in any penalty shoot-out will not be taken into consideration.

21. DISTINGUISHED GENERAL TECHNICAL RULES

21.1 KEY OPERATING BODIES

SUPERVISION, CONTROL AND ARBITRATION COMMISSION (SCAC)

The SCAC is the highest authority of the EUG and controls overall organisational and technical aspects of the EUG. The SCAC is responsible for the interpretation of EUSA Rules and Regulations and MOR, for the supervision and smooth running of the EUG, settling any dispute, examining and dealing with any complaints or protests of a non-technical nature, taking emergency sanctions against participants (teams or individuals) who violate the EUSA Rules and Regulations, deciding of any other matters not covered in these Regulations, at the time of the EUG.

AN UNIVERSITIE

The SCAC is composed by: SVC members, OC chair, OC Project Director and two (2) other OC representatives; lead by SVC chair. The mandate of the SCAC members terminates with the conclusion of the EUG.

SCAC Members will cooperate in a way to find compromise whenever possible. In case of voting, decisions will be taken by a simple majority of those present and voting. In case of equality of votes, the SCAC Chair shall have a casting vote. All decisions taken by the SCAC at the time of the EUG are final.

COMPETITION TECHNICAL COMMISSION (CTC)

The CTC is responsible for: confirming the competition system (format) and daily schedule, dealing with any complaints or protests of technical nature and taking sanctions of a technical nature, appointing additional bodies and allocating responsibilities which might be required by rules of the concerned ISF/ESF or by necessities of the competition.

A CTC for each competition in the EUG program is set up by EUSA EC. The mandate of the CTC members terminates with the conclusion of the competition.

The CTC is composed of: the EUSA EC representative who is the chair; two (2) OC representatives, EUSA TD and the ATD.

The CTC is supervised by and reports to SCAC.

The chair of the CTC together with SCAC representative, two (2) days prior to the start of the competition, will convene a CTC meeting and a GTM one (1) day prior to the start of the competition.

CTC decisions will be taken by a simple majority of those present and voting. In case of equality of votes, the CTC chair shall have a casting vote. All decisions taken by the CTC, when agreed with SCAC are final.

TECHNICAL DELEGATE (TD)

EUSA EC appointed the TD(s) and the ATD(s) for each sport in the program of the EUG.

Prior to the start of the competition, the TD shall:

- maintain close cooperation with the EUSA Sports Manager and with the representative of the OC for the sport concerned:
- ensure that the regulations of the respective ESF/ISF, EUSA Technical Regulations and MOR are observed in the phase of preparation of the competition;
- inspect the sports venues, equipment and materials to be used during the competition, at the time of EUSA Convention and/or additional inspection visits;
- gather exact information related to:
 - ightarrow the number and performance level of the participating teams and/or competitors;
 - -> the number and qualification of the referees and match officials provided by OC and/or proposed by participating teams:
 - ightarrow the number and quality of sports equipment and materials, play grounds and sports venues;
- supervise a system for the appointment of referees and other match officials. TD shall confirm the referees latest two (2) months before the start of competition;
- determine the provisional competition system (format) and schedule;
- together with the OC representative, prepare the Technical Handbook of the competition at least one (1) month prior to the EUG for SVC authorization;
- prepare PowerPoint presentation at least one (1) week before the GTM for SVC authorization.

TD is responsible for the interpretation of the technical part of the Technical Handbook.

One (1) day prior to the start of the competition, the TD will convene a technical meeting to which they shall invite: ATD, EUSA Sports Manager, appointed referees, referee observers (if nominated), OC responsible for sport and match officials (if needed).





TD will actively participate in the GTM by presenting the Technical Regulations and together with the SCAC representative by making a draw according to Technical Regulations.

• During the competition, the TD shall:

- → maintain close cooperation with the SCAC representative and members of CTC;
- \rightarrow assign duties to the ATD;
- → manage the competition in accordance with the EUSA and ESF/ISF regulations;
- → manage and appoint referees and match officials for the competition;
- treat and solve technical protests and technical issues;
- confirm results of matches and final teams/individuals standings;
- participate in the Opening and Closing ceremony (if it is in the period of competition), and actively participate in the Awards ceremony.

21.2 TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

GENERAL SPORT RULES

The technical part of the EUSA competitions is organized on the basis of the most recent published version of EUSA Rules and Regulations, ISF and/or ESF Regulations of respective sport and with the Technical Handbook of the competition. In case of any dispute, EUSA Rules and Regulations shall always be considered first.

• Official days are:

- Day 0: delegation arrivals, accreditation procedure, training sessions;
- Day 1: GTM and training sessions
- Day 2-9: competition, training session, awards ceremony;
- → Day after the last Awards ceremony: delegation departures.

Duration of the competition is in accordance with the Technical Regulations of respective sport. Competition may include a rest day.

Any participating team or individual, after being approved by the draw, shall participate in all scheduled matches.

In the team competitions, there are normally two (2) stages; the first stage (playing in groups, round robin system) and the second stage (play-off format, single or double elimination system), set according to the respective sport's regulations. Last group matches of the first stage, shall be played at the same time, whenever possible.

The university team of the host city or in its absence the host country's highest ranked team will be placed on first (1) place in group A (A1).

In case weather conditions impede the competition, it is up to SCAC and CTC to decide on further running/schedule of the competition.

Competition system for team competitions shall be prepared in such a way, that competition concludes with matches for all final places (i.e. 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th, 13th, 15th, etc.). Taking part in conciliation tournament is compulsory.

For individual competitions, if the matches for all final places are not organized due to the nature of a sport discipline, the final ranking which determines each place shall be nevertheless prepared.

The matches for the bronze and gold medals shall always be played as the last, no other matches shall be played at this time. These 2 (two) matches shall be played in the late afternoon or evening. The gold medal match shall be the last match of the EUG.

Playing surface, equipment and materials meet ISF standards.

OC will provide the necessary equipment/materials for results processing, competition and match managing using EUSA software where applicable.

REFEREES AND MATCH OFFICIALS

Only referees with an international license issued by ISF/ESF or at least with the highest national licence issued by NSF are allowed to be involved in EUSA competitions. Match officials with enough experience in national competitions are allowed to be involved in EUSA competitions.

Referees shall respect Referee Code of Conduct. Referees officiate matches in accordance with: ISF/ESF rules and regulations; their knowledge and experiences; their best capability and performance. Protests on referee decisions are not allowed, if it is not regulated differently in the ISF/ESF Regulations of the respective sport.



Sufficient numbers of referees and match officials will be provided by the OC, if this is not regulated differently in the Technical Regulations. In such cases:

- If a participating team must include in its delegation a referee at its own cost, and it fails to fulfil this obligation, it must
 pay a penalty fee (defined in the Technical Regulations of respective sport) to the OC. Approved referees nominated
 by the participating teams corresponding to the required level shall be integrated under the same conditions as the
 domestic referees;
- If there is no obligation to include a referee in participating team delegation, the team may bring a referee at its own cost, only if it is allowed by the Technical Regulations, and if the nominated referee is approved by the EUSA TD and the OC.
- EUSA has the right to appoint referees directly or in cooperation with ISF/ESF; in this case, participating teams will be charged the refereeing fee, defined by EUSA.

The TD of the respective sport in cooperation with the OC confirms the referees nominated by the delegation and/or submitted by the OC two (2) months prior to the competition.

The OC provide a referee attaché (or coordinator) for each sport of the program.

EUSA does not provide any daily allowances/fees for any referee and sport/competition official.

In the competition where referees come from different countries, whenever possible:

- referees should not officiate the match where the team from their country is playing;
- referees from the same country should not constitute the majority, officiating the match.

Referees shall bring their own official uniforms and wear it during the matches, if not approved differently by TD or defined differently in Technical Regulations of the respective sport. Uniform colours to be used are decided by TD.

Referees and match officials are appointed by TD for each match.

TD may exclude referees and match officials from the competition, if they:

- do not officiate in accordance: with the ISF/ESF Laws of the Game and EUSA Rules and Regulations;
- do not officiate in the Fair Play Spirit;
- do not respect EUSA Referee Code of Conduct;
- refuse to officiate the match, for which they are appointed;
- do not participate actively in all formal competition activities organized for referees;
- support publicly one of the teams / athletes during competition;
- their behaviour, health and/or physical condition are not acceptable.

Referee shall receive on a proposal of TD a Letter of Recognition or commemorative medal to be delivered before the end of the competition.

Referees should take part in the referee meetings, GTM, Opening and closing ceremony (if ceremonies are in the program during the competition). First referee meeting shall take place on the day of GTM.

REFEREES CODE OF CONDUCT

Referees are expected to always maintain the utmost respect for the sport.

Referees are expected to conduct themselves honourably at all times and maintain the dignity of their position.

Referees are expected to always honour an assignment or any other contractual obligation.

Referees will not tolerate nor allow abusive behaviour or language.

Referees are expected to attend training meetings and clinics so as to know the EUSA Rules and Regulations, their proper interpretation and their application. Referees are expected to know the rules and regulations of the respective sport.

Referees are expected to strive to achieve maximum teamwork with fellow officials.

Referees are expected to show respect for other referees, coaches and participants.

Referees are expected to not make statements about the competition except to clarify an interpretation of rules.

Referees are expected to not discriminate against nor take any undo advantage of any individual, team or group on the basis of gender, race, ethnic origin, cultural background, sexual orientation, religion, or political affiliation.





COMPETITORS AND OFFICIALS EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORMS

Competitors and Officials shall wear equipment and uniforms in accordance with ISF/ESF rules. Competitor, who violates these rules, can be refused to play or expelled from the match. The team of a competitor whose official match uniform contains political, religious or personal slogans or statements will be sanctioned in accordance with EUSA Disciplinary Protocol.

The jersey of the competitor shall contain the name of the university and optionally the name of the competitor; no other name can be used. Names on jersey shall be written in Latin letters. The country flag may be used on uniform only in case the name of university appears as well. Sponsors logotype may appear on equipment and uniforms of the competitor in accordance with the ISF/ESF rules.

Where the use of competitor playing number is required, the competitor must use the same number during the whole competition.

Competitors and Officials are not allowed to wear or bring on the playing field any national, political, cultural or religious symbols or slogans, and/or play such audio/video material.

GENERAL TECHNICAL MEETING

The GTM is a mandatory part of competition.

The GTM will be organised in a large and representative room equipped with audio and video system.

The GTM is called by the CTC chair together with SCAC representatives, one (1) day prior to the start of the competition. Invited attendees: the SCAC, the CTC, the NSF/ESF/ISF representative (if nominated), the OC representatives, the HoD (maximum two (2) persons per delegation), the NUSAs coordinators (if present), referees and other guests.

- The GTM, after the welcome message of CTC chair, is divided in three parts:
 - → Part 1: organizational part of the EUG, presented by the OC representative;
 - Part 2: technical part of the competition, presented by the TD;
 - Part 3: the draw of the competition (optionally, if required by the competition format), carried out by the TD and EUSA Sport Representative.

The team representatives may ask questions about all aspects of the competition, if time allows.

The GTM shall not exceed ninety (90) minutes.

• Agenda of the GTM meeting:

- Introduction (of the members of the SCAC)
- → Welcome speech by CTC Chair
- About EUSA (short video)
- EUSA Incident policy (short video)
- Organizational Matters (presentation)
- Competition/Technical Regulations (presentation by the EUSA TD) + Future Events
- 🔶 The Draw

• The OC representative will give a presentation (approx. 10-15 min.) to the Heads of Delegations, providing them with the essential information on organizational matters of all the functional areas, such as:

- Accommodation and services
- → Catering
- > Sports Venues (Training venues; procedure for booking the training venues etc.)
- Transportation
- Security and Medical Services
- → Opening, Closing and Awards Ceremonies
- Social and Cultural Activities
- Delivering OC information and INFO points
- → OC Contacts

THE DRAW PROCEDURE

The draw procedure shall be:

- \rightarrow in agreement with the competition system (format);
- explained to the GTM audience;
- carried out in front of the team representatives.

Names of the participating teams can be put in opaque balls in advance. The opening of the balls shall be done transparently, showing to the audience who is drawn.

The draw procedure cannot be repeated, unless a mistake is done, and this is approved by the TD and SCAC Representative.

The results of the draw shall be delivered to participating teams immediately after the GTM.





EUSA RANKING LIST

The EUSA Ranking list is used to define the pools for the draw of the first stage of competition.

- EUSA Ranking List is made, as follows:
 - The points are attributed to the teams based on the final standing of the competition; only one, the highest placed team of the NUSA, gets the points. Accumulated points are calculated for NUSA.
 - Points are delivered as follows:
 - Points accumulated within the last four (4) years determine the EUSA Ranking List, published annually by the EUSA Office.

EUSA Ranking List is used in all EUSA team competitions. In the cases that countries have the same ranking, the results from the previous EUSA competition in that sport will be observed when preparing the competition draw. Countries positioning will be considered, regardless of which university was represented at the previous competition.

If additional international ranking lists (ISF and/or ESF) of the respective sport are taken into consideration, the EUSA Ranking List shall be always considered first (exceptions are possible with SCAC approval and must be communicated during GTM the latest).

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MATCH RESULTS & PROTEST

Each match finishes with the result, announced by referee or match official.

Results are published on the official competition website/results.eusa.eu and social media immediately after the match by the OC. They have unofficial status.

Results become official after TD confirmation.



- HoD or an authorised representative of a team may file protest on results to the TD:
 - ightarrow within twenty (20) minutes after the end of the match on match result;
 - before the start of next competition day on confirmed results.

Each protest shall be accompanied by a deposit of two hundred (200) EUR except for the following sports: Basketball, Beach Handball, Handball, Football, Futsal, Volleyball and Water Polo where the deposit is five hundred (500) EUR. If the protest is upheld, the fee will be returned. CTC and SCAC deal with the protest and their decision is final.

Competition results in electronic version are kept in EUSA Archive.

- The protests shall be submitted:
 - → during the GTM for draw related protests,
 - → within twenty (20) minutes after the end of the match to the TD for the match issues,
 - ightarrow before the start of next competition day on published results to the TD for the published issues,
 - during the competition to the CTC for technical issues,
 - during the competition to the SCAC for non-technical issues,
 - → within seven (7) days after the EUG to the EUSA EC for the EUG issues.

AWARDS AND TITLES

EUSA presents awards to the winners during the Awards ceremony.

The winners of competitions, normally first three top ranked teams / competitors, will get cups, medals and other awards as listed in Technical Regulations of respective sport. Medal and Awards-winners are obliged to attend the Awards ceremony.

The winner of the competition (team and individual tournaments) is awarded with the title "European Universities Champion" as listed in Technical Regulations of the respective sport.

The list of the additional awards is stipulated in the Technical Regulations of respective sport.

Only the awards listed in these regulations could be granted during the Awards ceremony.

- EUSA presents following awards after the conclusion of the EUG (normally during the annual EUSA Gala):
 - The Most Active University
 - the Best University
 - the Most Active NUSA
 - the Most Successful NUSA
 - → Enno Harms Fair Play Award

EUSA AWARDS

EUSA awards have officially recognized excellence in the field of university sport for many years, across the areas of sporting performance, sport development, lifelong dedication, fair play, inclusion, and many, many more. These awards are attributed to acknowledge and celebrate the achievements and contributions of individuals, universities and associations whose recent impact on European University Sport deserves recognition and praise.

Most Active University

The most active university award is determined by participation of individuals and teams in the European Universities Games or Championships. Each university receives points for the number of individual athletes and university teams they send to compete in EUSA events. The university/universities with the highest points at the end of the year are recognised with the most active university award.

Best University

The best university is determined by the sports achievements and results in EUSA competitions. Each team taking part in team sports of the European Universities Games or Championships gets points for their university when they participate. The final ranking represents a sum of all results, and points are given to each university.

Most active NUSA

The most active National University Sports Association is determined by participation of teams and number of participants in the European Universities Games or Championships. Additional points are given for organization of EUSA events.

Most Successful NUSA

The most successful National University Sports Association is determined by the results and final placement of the university's athletes in the European Universities Games or Championships.

Enno Harms Fair Play

EUSA annually awards the recognition for Fair Play, taking into account the play's gesture/ situation during the EUSA sporting events which stand out the most. Enno Harms Fair Play Award is named after the first EUSA President who was very much devoted to fair play.





21.3 MEDICAL REGULATIONS

MEDICAL SERVICES

- Medical coverage will be provided for the EUG in accordance with EUSA Rules & Regulations.
- Cooperation with nearby medical service-providers are established.
- Special attention is paid to all high-risk sports, by providing ambulance vehicle with doctor/paramedic and driver on site throughout competitions. A formal agreement is established with local ambulance service for the replacement of this vehicle (and staff) where it leaves the venue to take a patient to a local hospital.

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- All other sports have a dedicated vehicle with driver for transferring injured athletes not requiring an ambulance to hospital.
- 24 hour on-site, medical cover is organised for EUG accommodation area.
- The OC will organise 24-hour access to medical services for EUG by having venue medical provision with easy access to local medical services.
- Medical cover is made available on a daily basis (during the working / competition / training hours) at all other venues of EUG (eg. canteen/restaurant, sport venue, accreditation centre, etc.). A fully equipped first aid box is also provided in each place where the medical service is assured.
- The services of the emergency department at the nearest hospital are secured.
- The OC ensures there is provision made for doctors to issue prescriptions for those medicines not available within the medical room and also not available over-the-counter at a local pharmacy to participants e.g. strong painkillers, antibiotics etc.

MEDICAL TEAM

- All sport venues have a medical team on duty during competition and medical service during official training times. Each competition is covered by an English-speaking medical doctor, qualified to a level appropriate for the respective sport with an emergency medical bag/box.
- The members of the medical team wear distinctive clothing: this will be white bibs labelled "MEDICAL TEAM".
- For combat sports there will be a doctor for each competition mat.
- The OC ensures all members of the medical team are adequately trained for the role they are to fulfil.

MEDICAL ROOM AND EOUIPMENT

Each sport venue and the EUG accommodation area will have a dedicated medical room equipped with:

- examination table and portable stretcher for injured competitors, additional stretchers will be available at near each playing field (team competition, except racket sports);
- an adequate supply of ice or cooling packs;
- first aid box and medical bag:
- automated external defibrillator (AED).

For high-risk sports - spinal immobilisation equipment (long board/scoop, collar, blocks) will be available.

The OC will pay attention to the availability of oxygen supply, orthopaedic equipment such as crutches, braces & slings etc. for high risk sports in particular.

The medical room will have good stretcher access to the field of play.

The OC will identify specific parking spaces for ambulance vehicles at each venue with defined routes of access and regress to /from the field of play.

DOPING CONTROL

EUSA and the OC are committed to the principles of fair play and uphold the principles of antidoping at all of its events.

Where it occurs and where present at EUG, the MC oversees that WADA Regulations on antidoping procedures are adhered to.

Any competitor found to test positive on doping control procedure will be excluded from all future EUSA events for the period of (2) years. In such circumstances a report will be submitted to WADA, ISF, to the rector of his university, NUSA and NSF.
